#### DO THE WORK OF CHRIST MESSIAH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL PLANNING RETREAT SATURDAY 30 APRIL 2022 (9 AM TO 4 PM) A DAY TO PRAY, PONDER, AND PROCLAIM

Nineteen members of Messiah came to pray together, ponder, and proclaim God's Word and to plan for the future work of God in this place.

We began with an opening service, Morning Prayer, which included readings from Romans 8:12–17 and John 14: 8–21. The sermon title was "Do the Work of Christ" based on John 14:12–14.

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer. (Psalm 19:14) Amen

The text for our meditation is in the Epistle reading from Revelation.

[Jesus said:] "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in Me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will He do, because I am going to the Father. Whatever you ask in My name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it." (John 14:12-14) Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

Back in January, on the Third Sunday after the Epiphany, we heard these words from St. Paul: *Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it* (1 Corinthians 12:27).

Earlier, in 1 Corinthians 12, St. Paul says,

#### For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit. (1 Cor 12:12-13)

Through the waters of our Baptism, the Holy Spirit has come upon us, dwells in us, and unites us as one body, the body of Christ. St. Paul also reminds us that as individual members of the body of Christ, we are gifts of Christ to the Church and to each other. Therefore, we have a responsibility to each other, to encourage and strengthen each other to stand against the false teachings of the world.

And He [Christ] gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness in Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into Him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love. (Ephesians 4:11–16)

As the body of Christ, we are indebted to Jesus for our forgiveness and salvation, and to each other as *The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ* (Romans 8:16–17a).

The body of Christ is to be the body of Christ by doing the works of Christ.

[Jesus said:] "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in Me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will He do, because I am going to the Father. Whatever you ask in My name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it." (John 14:12-14)

## And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:7) Amen

After a brief break, we reviewed church boards, the chairs and meeting times, along with the budget for 2022 and how we are doing so far.

We then spent some time reviewing the past and recent present, talking about prouds and sorries, things that we need to learn from and not repeat, and things that God has done among us that need to continue.

Then we discussed the question: How do we get the world to see the Risen Christ?

Based on some insights from *How Does America Hear the Gospel* by William A. Dyrness and *The Younger Evangelicals–Facing the Challenges of the New World* by Dahart F. Wahhar, we discussed.

How do the Gospel and Culture Interact?

A Theological and Evangelistic Method for Americans,

What is the Church?

What is the Nation?

What is the Church in the Nation? and

What Shall We Do?

Before lunch, we prayerfully pondered Jesus' words in John 15:7–8 where He says, "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be My disciples."

After our lunch break, we started to plan for the future of the Gospel ministry here at Messiah.

We talked about adding bible study classes and a study in our Lutheran Confessions in the Book of Concord. We also talked about adding a Grief Share class and looking into the possibility of Steven Ministries at Messiah.

We began to set up committees to investigate work that needs to be done at Messiah in the following areas:

Community Service

Internet, Social Media, Website, etc...

Property and Facilities

One, Five, Ten Year Plans

The heads of these committees will be recruiting help from members to do research and make recommendations for the future.

Our Spring Voters' Assembly meeting will be on Sunday 15 May.

Our Fall Voters' Assembly meeting will be in November.

Those in attendance on Saturday 30 April agreed that we need to gather again in six months to review progress and continue planning. The next retreat will occur on Saturday 5 November.

Our closing devotion and prayer was based the end of the Gospel of Luke and the beginning of his second volume, the Acts of the Apostles, where the Word of God declares that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all nations (Luke 24:47) and encourages us to be devoted to the apostles teachings and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers (Acts 2:42), while the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved (Acts 2:47b).

#### Lutheran World Relief

#### Spotlight on Mite Grants

Praise be to God! All the 2020-2022 Mission Grants of the LWML Texas District have been paid in full and there was even an overage that will be applied to the next biennium's projects. Thank you for your mite contributions. All those coins do add up. New mission grants will be selected at the LWML Texas District Convention in Houston this June, Three-fourths of your

mite donations go towards Texas projects and one fourth go to national LWML projects. The following are mission projects of the national LWML.

**Spiritual and Physical Food for Children of Peru -La Mision Luterana del Peru — \$56,750** Castillo Fuerte (Mighty Fortress) Mercy House is an outreach of the LCMS Missions in Latin America and the Caribbean and was started in 2013. The people of Lima are unable to fully finance the work of the Mercy House, and the work of our missionaries, who feed the souls with the Word of God and show the love of Christ by feeding the parents and children's stomachs. Families come to receive food for their physical bodies, and they stay because of Jesus' love for them as He feeds them the spiritual food which sustains their souls. The healing power of Christ's love and redemption shine into the broken lives of the families making them whole. This grant would partner with La Mision Luterana and Castillo Fuerte to work together to care for the children and families of Lima, Peru, by providing for the needs of the body and of the soul.

## "Ends of Earth" Scholarships-Mission Opportunities Short Term (MOST) Ministries — \$50,000

MOST Ministries is receiving more requests from LCMS missionaries and national church leaders to provide teams to go to the "ends of the earth" places such as Uganda, Tanzania, Kenya, Ethiopia, Ghana, South Africa, Thailand, Peru, and Sri Lanka to work side-by-side with missionaries, sharing the Gospel. The travel cost (up to \$5,050) of the short-term mission trips to these distant places has become prohibitive and has made it challenging for willing people to join a team. Currently, team members are personally responsible for their total per person cost. Not only do they use personal funds, but they are encouraged to reach out to members of the body of Christ to participate in the mission with encouragements, prayers, and financial support. This grant would offer financial support to cover up to one-half the cost of each participant, not to exceed \$2,000.
