Duke Regional Hospital ED, Inpatient Guidelines for Covid-19 Testing Last revised: June 30, 2020

The table below outlines various COVID tests that are available at DRH and preferred indications for the same. DRH CMO team will continue to review these indications and provide updates as needed. Attached please find screen shot for COVID testing order panel with indications for ordering specific type of test with isolation recommendations.

## **Test Definitions**

- 1. Point of Care Testing (POCT)/ Rapid test: This test is similar to other POCT performed across the health system and requires that a specific device is physically located in the clinical environment. For DRH this device will be located in the lab. Turnaround Times (TAT) for tests result will be less than an hour. POCT units and testing kits are limited and judicious use of these tests is recommended.
- 2. Inpatient Testing: This in-house molecular diagnostic test (performed at DUH with courier transporting specimens from DRH to DUH every 2 hours) currently has a median TAT of 5-6 hours from test order to test result.
- 3. Outpatient Testing: This in-house molecular diagnostic test (done at DUH with courier transporting specimens from DRH to DUH every 2 hours) has a targeted TAT of 12-24 hours.
- 4. IP/Administrative Test: This in-house molecular diagnostic test (done at DUH with courier transporting specimens from DRH to DUH every 2 hours) has a targeted TAT of 12-24 hours. It is not linked to a "Rule out COVID" infection status and is used when indicated for screening asymptomatic patients or removing isolation precautions in a patient who has recovered.
- 5. Preoperative screen: This molecular diagnostic test (done at DUH with courier transporting specimens from DRH to DUH every 2 hours) has a targeted TAT of 7-15 hours. It is not linked to a "Rule out COVID" infection status and is used when indicated for screening asymptomatic patients who will undergo procedure or surgery who are not level 1-4.

If emergent care is required prior to receiving test results, use appropriate PPE.
