Check the drop-down menu for activities, horseback riding and find the trails open to horses before you ride. <u>Horseback</u> <u>Riding Trails | Geauga Park District</u> **The equine industry** in Ohio is a significant part of the state's agricultural and recreational landscape. The state has a long history with horses, and today, it remains a major player in both the national and regional equine sectors. The industry encompasses various aspects, including horse racing, breeding, training, and recreational activities such as trail riding and shows. Below are key elements that define Ohio's equine industry:

#### 1. Economic Impact

- **Contributions to the economy**: The Ohio equine industry contributes millions of dollars to the state's economy. According to the Ohio Department of Agriculture, the economic impact of the equine industry in Ohio is estimated to be around \$1 billion annually. This includes direct spending on horse-related activities, as well as the secondary industries that support horses, such as feed, equipment, and veterinary services.
- **Employment**: The industry also supports thousands of jobs in Ohio, including breeders, trainers, farm workers, veterinarians, and equine-related service providers.

#### 2. Horse Racing

- **Thoroughbred and Standardbred Racing**: Ohio is known for its horse racing industry, particularly for both Thoroughbred and Standardbred horses (such as trotters and pacers). The state's racetracks offer both live and simulcast racing, contributing to the economy through gambling and tourism.
- Major Racetracks: Key racetracks in Ohio include:
  - **Thistledown Racino** (Cleveland area) Primarily hosts Thoroughbred racing and also features a casino.
  - **Scioto Downs** (Columbus) Known for Standardbred harness racing and also operates a racino with slot machines.
  - **Miami Valley Gaming** (Lebanon) Another racino that hosts Standardbred races and offers gaming.
- **Ohio State Racing Commission**: Regulates the horse racing industry in Ohio, overseeing racing operations and ensuring integrity in the sport.

#### 3. Horse Breeding

- Ohio has a strong reputation for breeding both Thoroughbred and Standardbred horses. The state offers incentives to encourage breeding, such as state-funded programs like the Ohio Breeders' Awards Program, which provides awards to breeders of Ohio-foaled horses.
- **Breeding Farms**: The state is home to several established breeding farms, especially in areas like the northern part of the state around Cleveland, and in rural parts of central and southern Ohio.

#### 4. Equestrian Sports & Recreation

- **Competitions**: Ohio hosts a wide range of equestrian events, from dressage and show jumping to western riding and rodeos. Large equestrian events like the **All American Quarter Horse Congress** in Columbus attract thousands of participants and spectators annually.
- **Trails & Parks**: Ohio offers extensive opportunities for horseback riding in state parks and through its **Equestrian Trail Program**. Popular areas for riding include the **Wayne National Forest** and **Hocking Hills**.
- **4-H and Youth Programs**: Ohio has a strong youth presence in the equine industry, largely through the **Ohio 4-H Youth Development program**. The program teaches young people horsemanship, responsibility, and care for animals.

#### 5. Equine Education and Research

- Ohio State University (OSU) has a highly regarded **Equine Studies Program**, which offers undergraduate and graduate degrees in areas related to equine science, animal science, and veterinary medicine. OSU also conducts research on equine health, nutrition, and breeding.
- Veterinary Care: Ohio is home to the College of Veterinary Medicine at OSU, which is a key institution for the care of horses and other animals. The college offers specialized training for veterinarians focused on equine medicine and has an equine hospital for treating horses. horses, especially in rural areas.

#### 6. Horse Auctions and Sales

- Ohio hosts several important horse auctions, including those for both Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds. These sales attract buyers from across the country and internationally, helping to foster Ohio's reputation in the equine marketplace.
- 7. Horse-Related Tourism
  - **Events and Shows**: Ohio has a variety of horse-related events that draw tourists and participants from across the country. The **All-American Quarter Horse Congress** in Columbus, for example, is one of the largest single-breed horse shows in the world.
  - **Horseback Riding**: Many visitors to Ohio take part in horseback riding in the state's many scenic locations. The Hocking Hills region, in particular, is a popular destination for riding.


#### 8. Horse Care & Facilities


