Bridge Closure at The West Woods:

The West Woods bridge will be under construction beginning this coming Monday, June 16, through May 2026. Bridge closure will depend on the work being conducted by the Ohio Department of Transportation. The West Woods and The West Woods Nature Center will remain open, but all parking will be consolidated to the top entrance lot, and a temporary pedestrian bridge will accommodate foot and horse traffic into the park.



Please also note that horse trailer parking may not always be available due to limited space. The walking distance from the parking lot to the Nature Center is approximately 0.4 mile. Thanks in advance for your cooperation during this lengthy but essential project!

NOTE THE EXTENSIVE CHANGES PLANNED FOR THE POLO FIELD

SOUTH CHAGRIN METROPARK PROPOSED ALL-PURPOSE TRAIL As of 6/27/25

Cleveland Metroparks are planning a paved all-purpose trail from Miles Road to South Woodland.

- Some portions of the proposed all-purpose trail run along Chagrin River Road, however a
 majority of the trail cuts through old growth forest, wetlands, and intersects the existing bridle
 trail at several points. Please see the attached map.
- On October 10, 2024 a community open house was held at Look About Lodge to obtain public feedback on the proposed South Chagrin plans. This event was not widely publicized.
 Findings from the Look About Lodge open house were presented to the Metro Parks Board on November 21, 2024. Please see attached excerpts from the presentation.
- The Moreland Hill Green Commission and Village residents are concerned about the proposed trail for several reasons:
 - Moreland Hills, recently designated a Tree City USA town, is committed to preserving the semi-rural nature of the community and the tree canopy within its boundaries. The proposed trail passes through the heart of Moreland Hills and will result in significant tree canopy reduction by cutting down many old growth trees.
 - The proposed paved trail passes through wetlands and flood prone areas. Adding miles
 of impervious surface to this area will result in more storm water runoff and impact the
 Village's infrastructure. Cuyahoga County residents are taxed for creating storm water
 runoff.
 - Adding a second trail, next to the existing bridle trail, in such a narrow strip of land will
 ruin the ambiance, solitude, and natural beauty of the area.
 - All-purpose trail and bridle trail intersection points will be detrimental to horses and their riders.
 - In the Winter, the bridle trail is a cross-country skiing and snowshoeing mecca enjoyed by many. As with other all-purpose trails in the Metroparks, this trail will most likely be plowed after each snowfall.
 - Bicyclists will continue to ride on Chagrin River Road since the proposed all-purpose trail is winding. The recently improved bridle trail is perfect for hikers, runners, horseback riders, and those wishing to savor nature.
