Think for a second about each letter used in this project. The English alphabet has 26 letters. These can join to form at least 700,000 different words. By ordering them "just-so," meaning can move from one person, and be received and returned by another. Look closely. **It's a <u>dance.</u>**

Can You Say What It Really Means?

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Taking It For Granted

Do you take anything in life for granted? When's the last time you thought about the food you eat, the water you drink, or even the air that you breathe? Often, the <u>importance</u> of such things is appreciated only by those forced to go without. Is air important? Ask someone suffering from asthma. Is food & water important? Ask those suffering from hunger or thirst.

Now — I'm not talking about your midmorning tummy-rumbles. Ask someone who is often forced by circumstances to go several days or more without a meal. Many of us don't often think about the things that are absolutely necessary to our existence. We can't even live without them, but we still take them for granted.

Do you take **Love** for granted? An easier question is: "do we take each other for granted?" Again, those going without can best answer the question. **How important is love really?** Ask a widow or orphan. Ask a parent who has lost their child. Ask a friend who stubbornly waited too long to mend a broken relationship. When love is broken or lost, it sure seems like it's all that really matters in the world. <u>It is!</u>

Meaning & Community

Have you considered how the words we use each day got their **meaning**? Most of us take meaning for granted – so notice this carefully. You are reading my words and receiving my intended message (I hope). This is called **communication** and it's a big part of what makes a **community** possible.

Right now, you and I share a <u>relationship</u>. I am a writer <u>giving</u> you my thoughts, and you are a reader <u>receiving</u> them. How does it work? Well, for our relationship to function, we both have to know what the words mean. Who decides? If I say "chicken," should you think "fish?" If I say "now," should you think "next-year." Of course not. If our relationship is to actually function, the meaning beneath our words has to be <u>objective.</u>

Whoa! Some "smart-folks" say that there's no such thing as objective meaning. Alright, imagine your waiter is showing off and doesn't jot down your order. He brings you a chicken-breast instead of the salmon that you ordered. Do you accept "your order" without comment and leave him a big tip? I doubt it. The chicken's going back. Why? Because the waiter got <u>the meaning</u> wrong. He failed to do his part in a functioning <u>Community</u>.

A Cornerstone: What's an Axiom?

Such failures are <u>misunderstandings</u> and result from instances of <u>confusion</u>. While confusion is a common problem (and a rapidly growing one)—it's the exception not the rule. Your embarrassed waiter will understand when you reject the plate and say: "I ordered the salmon." He'll even perceive: "you should have written it down" from the hungry & frustrated look "written" on your face.

Notice this carefully. Meaning gets lost in the absence of a functioning relationship. Think hard. Is there anything in the world that doesn't depend on something else to make it work. I dare you to find one. Whether physical, psychological, or spiritual – meaning describes functioning relationships or the absence of one.

A <u>First-Fact</u> or <u>Ultimate-Object</u> must be beneath all objective meaning. We can't function without it, and we all take it for granted. An <u>axiom</u> is basic meaning that can't be reduced. Axioms make all other meaning possible. A <u>Chief-Axiom</u> works like a <u>Cornerstone</u> binding all meaning together in the right order, and enabling us to understand reality. It is <u>Unity</u>.
