Basic function of the 4 verbs.

TI verb: Pōqsaehkah – Put it on

Example: Pōqsaehkah eneh paehpakōweyan
Put on that shirt

TA verb: Pōqsaehkahaew – s/he puts it on him/her

Example: Pōqsaehkahlen nīcian
Dress the child

AI verb: Pēnesew – S/he is clean

Example: Ayom nīcian pēnesew
This child is clean

II verb: Pēnat – It is clean

Example: Eyom mahkāēhsen pēnat
This shoe is clean

A couple verbs to apply to your new animate nouns.
