#### The One True Superpower

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.

~ Ephesians 3:20-21

Happy birthday to our home! Our nation celebrates its Independence Day on the 4th of July, as we declared our independence from England, who was the world's superpower at the time. It was a bold and daring declaration, for no other nation had a more expansive empire or a more controlling influence upon the seas than the British. And yet our eventual victory in the Revolutionary War would set in motion the growth of a new nation eager to fulfill its promise and potential. Many years later, during and after World War 2, the United States would emerge as a superpower, exerting military, economic, and political influence around the world. Soon after, during the Cold War years, the USA and the USSR became competing superpowers in a struggle between East and West, communism vs. capitalism. Today, following the collapse of the Soviet Union, we are considered the world's one true superpower, though China is emerging as a potential rival superpower.

Yet when it comes to this world, and the One who made it and rules over it, there is no rival to the one true superpower. The Bible declares in Psalm 66:3-4, "Say to God, 'How awesome are your deeds! So great is your power that your enemies cringe before you. All the earth bows down to you; they sing praise to you, they sing praise to your name."

Later this month, we will start a new sermon series on the book of Ephesians called "Immeasurably More." A theme verse for the series is found in Ephesians 3:20, which reminds us that God is "able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us." The word "power" is used more times in Ephesians than almost any other New Testament epistle (with the exception of Romans and 1 Corinthians). This power, the same power that raised Jesus from the dead, is available to all who believe (Eph. 1:19-20). This, then, is what could truly be called the world's one true superpower: the power of God at work in and through the people of God for the glory of God, in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever.



### **How Will We Use Our Freedom?**

In 2000, Cornealious Anderson was sentenced to 13 years for robbery. The 23-year-old was released on bail and told to await orders to show up to prison. But due to a clerical error, those orders never came. Some people might have taken advantage of such freedom and committed more crimes. But Anderson started a business, coached youth football and volunteered at church, earning respect in his community.

Thirteen years later, when Missouri officials discovered the error and put Anderson behind bars, an online petition called for his release. A judge agreed that Anderson was a changed man and, again, he was freed.

What would you do with such undeserved freedom? What do we do with the unmerited freedom God grants us despite our sin, and with the freedoms we celebrate on July 4? May we follow Anderson's example and use our freedoms — social and spiritual — to serve others.

The pastor says he was inspired by *Peanuts* character Lucy van Pelt, who has the "audacity, the courage to brazenly sit there out in public and offer to deal with important matters."


#### EMBRACING INDEPENDENCE



Make this candle to keep uninvited insects from your outdoor summer meals.

#### What you need:


- Lime
- 10-20 whole cloves
- · Birthday candle
- 4 toothpicks
- Adult help



#### What you do:

- 1. Have an adult slice the lime in half. Cut off the rounded end of one half so it can stand without rolling.
- 2. Insert 10 cloves into the cut sides of each half
- 3. Stand the bottom half on a plate. Insert the candle in the center.
- 4. Insert the 4 toothpicks in the cut side of the bottom half. Then place the other half atop the toothpicks.
- 5. Before dinner, have an adult light the candle that's between the two lime halves. The flame's heat will warm the lime and create a smell that insects
- 6. Supervise the flame. Blow it out when it reaches the bottom lime.
