What's In a Name

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus **Christ**, through whom we have gained access by **faith** into this **grace** in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the **glory** of God.

- Romans 5:1-2

Long before Halloween became a scary day, October 31 has been a special day because of what took place on that day over 500 years ago. It is known as Reformation Day, because on that day, in 1517, Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses—a summary of his disagreements with leaders of

the church and a call for change in the church on the door of a church in Wittenberg, Germany, setting in motion what would come to be known as the Reformation. At that time, it was perhaps the greatest movement of God in the Church since Pentecost.

It led to seismic upheaval as the Protestant branch of the Christian Church was born and spread throughout Europe, eventually making its way across the ocean to what would become the United States, and around the world. It was a movement that did not initially seek to break away from the Catholic church, but sought to bring reforms to the church that would bring it back to a focus on the Bible and the gospel, to relying on the grace of God and trusting in faith in Jesus for salvation. But when this call for change was renounced by the church hierarchy, the movement turned its focus to starting something new: a church that would be reformed and always reforming according to the Word of God. We are Reformed because of the Reformation.



At the heart of the Reformation is what has come to be known as the "Five Solas" – five Latin phrases with the word sola (from which we get our English word solo), a word that means alone. They became the rallying cry of the Reformation, and formed the foundation of Reformed

beliefs. Here is what they are:

Sola Gratia Sola Fide Sola Christus Sola Scriptura Sola Deo Gloria Grace Alone Faith Alone Christ Alone Scripture Alone Glory of God Alone

This is what our name means. This is why we are Reformed. Our enduring hope and our eternal salvation are by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone, guided by scripture alone, for the glory of God alone. And this is why we have so much more to celebrate than candy and costumes and pumpkins at the end of October. For what was set in motion centuries ago in the Protestant Reformation has changed the church and changed the world. And the next time you're talking with someone about where you go to "Reformed? church. and someone asks. Reformed from what?" You can tell them what's in a name.


"Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?"
