HYMN HISTORY

"WHAT A FRIEND WE HAVE IN JESUS"

Joseph M. Scriven (1819-1886), an Irish immigrant to Canada, wrote this text in 1855. Because his life was filled with grief and trials, Scriven often needed the solace of the Lord as described in his famous hymn.

Educated at Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland, he enrolled in a military college to prepare for an army career. However, poor health forced him to give up that ambition.

Soon after came a second blow—his fiancée died in a drowning accident on the eve of their wedding in 1844. To put as much distance as possible between himself and that tragedy, Scriven then moved to Canada. While living there, he became engaged again, but his fiancée became ill and died before they could be married.

Scriven received word that his mother was ill. He couldn't afford to return to Ireland, so he sent his mother a poem in the hope that it would comfort her. He later submitted a copy of his poem to a religious journal, where it was published. A few years later, in 1866, he died.

But his poem lived on in ways that he could never have imagined. Ira Sankey, a musician who worked with Dwight L. Moody, published it in a book of hymns, and Moody had it sung in his evangelistic meetings. Soon it was one of the best-known hymns in America. Missionaries took it abroad, where people sang it in many languages.
