

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PLANTERSVILLE, TEXAS ABOLISHING THE OFFICE OF MARSHAL; AND CONFERING THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE ON THE GRIMES COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Plantersville, Texas finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Plantersville, Texas that the office of marshal be abolished and the duties of the office be conferred on the Grimes County Sheriff's Office.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PLANTERSVILLE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the office of marshal is hereby abolished, and the duties of the office is conferred on Grimes County Sheriff's Office; and as the elected marshal has previously resigned from that office no elected marshal is being removed from office; all in accordance with Texas Local Government Code Section 23.029.

Section 2. This Ordinance will take effect immediately upon passage.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 4. In the event any clause, phrase, provision, sentence, or part of the Ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this Ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the Board of Aldermen of the City of Plantersville, Texas declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.
