YSA Soccer Disciplinary Guidelines

April 2015

- On disciplinary actions, all YSA soccer practices and soccer scrimmages/matches shall follow the FIFA Laws of the Game in principle, with amendments made by the YSA Board solely on its discretion. A copy of the current FIFA Laws of the Game can be downloaded from FIFA's web site:

- 2. A player who receives a Red Card (send-off offence) must leave the vicinity of the field of play immediately, and serve a one game suspension, i.e., be forbidden from participating the next practice/match.
- 3. A player who receives a second Red Card in the same season must serve a 3-game suspension.
- 4. A player who receives a third Red Card in the same season will be suspended for the rest of the season plus the first 4 games of the next season.
- 5. Player suspension shall be enforced by the Team Coach, and assisted by the Team Manager.
- 6. A foul¹ must be called by one of the following individuals who is actively involved in the play on the field, and has witnessed the infringement:
 - a. The Referee
 - b. The Assistant Referee
 - c. Team Coach
 - d. Team Assistant Coach
- 7. A misconduct² must be called by one of the following individuals who has witnessed the infringement:
 - a. The Referee
 - b. The Assistant Referee
 - c. Team Coach
 - d. Team Assistant Coach
 - e. Team Manager

- 8. Foul and misconduct occurred during practice shall be treated as if they were occurred during a formal match or an informal scrimmage.
- 9. A Field Marshall (FM) or Field Coordinator (FC) is to be appointed by the YSA Board for each field (McMean's, Beckendorff, and Seven Lakes). FM/FC shall be called to handle any send-off offence by the Team Coach or the Team Manager. The sent-off player(s) shall be escorted to the parking lot by the FM/FC. The FM/FC shall email the official report of the incident to the YSA Board (soccer.kysa@gmail.com) within 24 hours of the incident.
- 10. An appeal from the sanctioned player or his/her representative must be emailed to the YSA Board (soccer.kysa@gmail.com) within 48 hours of the incident to be considered by the Board for possible reduced sanction. The YSA Board shall render a decision within 72 hours from the time when the written appeal is received in email.
- 11. These disciplinary actions also apply to anyone in the vicinity of the field of play, including but not limited to coaches, team managers, parents, and spectators.
- 12. The discipline actions are suggested to be less stringent to younger players (under 7 years old) due to their age and playful nature. However, final interpretations of the rules will come from the YSA board.

Notes:

- 1: A foul is an offence occurred during a match. It can only be committed by an active player when the ball is in play.
- 2: A misconduct is an offence occurred when:
 - a. The ball is out of bounds or play is stopped by the referee during a match or stopped by a coach during an informal scrimmage. The infringement can be committed by a player on the field, or by a substitute on the bench, either against an opponent or against his/her own teammate or the referee or the coach or a spectator.
 - b. The ball is in play, a player commits the infringement against his/her own teammate or the referee or the coach or a spectator.

The difference between foul and misconduct is the method to restart the game. There is no difference in penalty and sanction.

Player Foul and Misconduct Definition:

- 1. Kicks or attempts to kick an opponent
- 2. Trips or attempts to trip an opponent
- 3. Jumps at an opponent
- 4. Charges an opponent

- 5. Strikes or attempts to strike an opponent
- 6. Pushes an opponent
- 7. Tackles an opponent
- 8. Spits at an opponent
- 9. Verbally threatens an opponent

Cautionable Offences (Yellow Card):

- 1. Unsporting behavior (players and substitutes)
- 2. Dissents by word or action (players and substitutes)
- 3. Persistent infringement of the Laws of the Game (players)

Sending-off Offences (Red Card):

- 1. Serious foul play
- 2. Violent conduct
- 3. Spits at an opponent or any other person
- 4. Uses offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or gestures
- 5. Receives a second caution in the same match
