It will be followed by a procession to the Mississippi River. The Holy Eucharist will be exposed in a 17 foot Monstrance with several viewing places along the river on the way to Convent.

Upcoming 4th Degree Honor Guards

Brother Sir Knight Carroll Clement, a Past Faithful Navigator of E.D. White Assembly #316 has passed away. We have been asked to provide an Honor Guard for his Visitation and Funeral Mass. If you are able, please arrive at Our Lady of Prompt Succor Catholic Church, 529 LA 20, Thibodaux, LA (the Church is in Chackbay), on Saturday, August 3rd, at 8:30 am. Visitation will be from 9:00 am until the Funeral Mass at 11:00 am. If you do not have a uniform, you may also participate in the visitation if you wear a dark suit, social baldric, and white gloves.

Here is some information concerning the Fête-Dieu du Mississippi.

August 14, Wednesday - Mass 8 am St. Joseph Cathedral, Baton Rouge with Bishop Duca. Honor Guard participation I highly recommend that you arrive to park by 7 as Parking is limited. Immediately following the mass, the procession will depart to the river dock. The Holy Eucharist will depart the dock at approximately 10:15 am.

If you plan to process please wear comfortable BLACK SHOES.
Only Loafers or Tennis NO SANDALS. You are free at that point.

CONVENT - Expected arrival of the Eucharist is Approximately 5:40 pm. Be there at least 45 minutes prior to arrival. The address is: American Commercial Barge Lines 6582 LA 44 Convent, La 70723. We will process to St. Michael's church which should take about 20 minutes.

August 15, Thursday - The Eucharist is expected to move back to the dock at 8:40 am Please arrive NO LATER than 8:15 am. We will process back to the dock and the Eucharist is expected to leave at approximately 10 am. You are free at this point.

NEW ORLEANS - The Eucharist is expected to arrive at 4:20 pm. Please arrive NO LATER than 3:50 pm. Arrival point is the Natchez Dock 400 Toulouse St. New Orleans, La 70130 (commonly called Woldenberg Park). There is parking in Parking lots close by at your expense.

Upon Arrival there will be a Benediction on the levee and a procession to St. Louis Cathedral, approximately 25 minutes. At the church there will be a mass which an Honor Guard will participate. You are free at the end of the ceremony to continue with festivities or go home. Those of you that cannot process and want to Honor Guard please meet the the front of the Cathedral for the Mass. You will have short time to organize as we will be in procession to attach to you.

It is my understanding that water will be provided at all point of stops. I also highly recommend if you plan to process to wear comfortable shoes. Loafers and Tennis will be allowed as long as ALL ARE BLACK. NO SANDALS.
