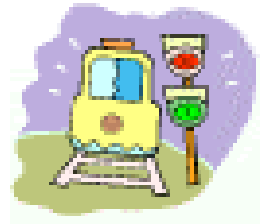

Three years this June, Kathleen and I took a trip to Alaska, 10 days on land, 5 at sea. One of the things we did was ride the White Pass and Yukon narrow gauge RR. Most tourists only ride the last 23 or so miles as we did from Fraser, BC to Skagway, Alaska or the reverse. One day, I was searching on YouTube on our large smart TV and came across a cab ride from Carcross, Yukon to Skagway for approximately 63 miles. The original route went to Whitehorse, Yukon, 110 miles from Skagway. Our bus stopped in the very little town of Carcross for about an hour. Way too short of time for me. As we were leaving, the White Pass was coming into town; our bus driver said she never saw the train coming in, in all the years she was driving to Carcross.

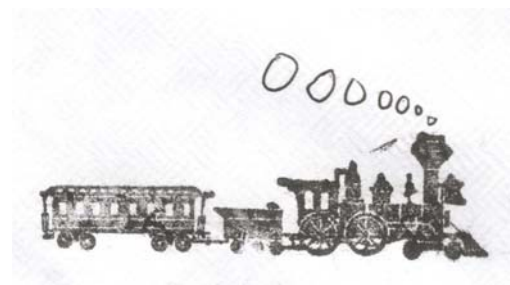
Getting back to the YouTube video, the ride from Carcross to Fraser I felt was more scenic than the last 23 miles. The narrator (British accent) starts off with a few short shots of engines and trains in Skagway and then jumps to Carcross. There he explains that the train in Carcross has a dead engine and they are bringing up a replacement from Skagway. You then see the live engine rearranging the train using a "Y" to do so. Once the consist is assembled we headed down to Skagway. Now we climbed into the cab and begin our ride down to Skagway. The ride will take over an hour. It has the most beautiful scenery, lakes and snowcapped mountains as the train hugs the shore line squeezing between the lake shore and sheer rock all on the other side of the track.



I thought that with all the time everyone has, watching this video may be fun and take our minds off the virus. Being in the cab you certainly see much more than a passenger riding in the coaches. 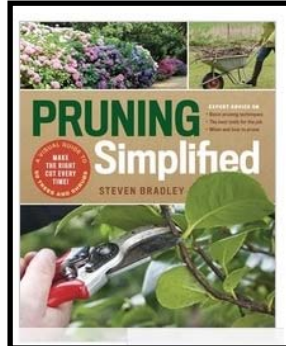
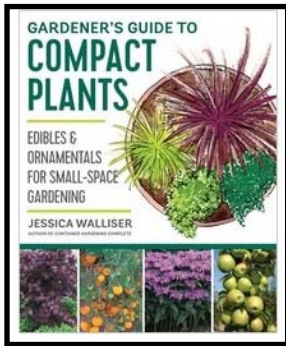

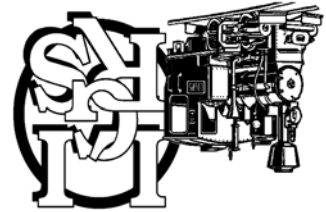
Quiz Solution



Steam engine #5972, in real life, is **5972 Olton Hall** a preserved [Great Western Railway Hall class](#) locomotive.

In the *Harry Potter* films, the locomotive is depicted pulling the [Hogwarts Express](#), a fictional train, made up of four (later five) [British Rail Mark 1](#) carriages. Scenes were filmed at [King's Cross railway station](#), pulling out of track 9^{3/4}, the [Glenfinnan Viaduct](#) and the [North Yorkshire Moors Railway](#) — along with internal scenes on board the train.
