50/50, Won by Kathleen Kmeth. Kathleen donated her winnings back to the club. The club received \$23.



Tom's "Did You Know?"



Although it was built in 1887 and 1897, the Holman train was not



created to improve rail travel. Instead, it was built to defraud people of their hard-earned money. In fact, the only difference between the Holman train and other steam trains of the day was that the Holman train had several wheels placed on top of each other.

The wheels served no practical purpose, but its inventors claimed that they made the train run faster.

The fraudulent scheme was so sophisticated that the train had its own patent and ran experimental trips. The Holman Locomotive Speed Truck Company, also a fraud, was formed to oversee the train's development.

The company attempted to raise \$10 million by selling fake shares of stock at \$25 per share. Many people fell for the swindle and lost their hard-earned money when the inventors disappeared.

Member Profiles



Art first encountered the LIGRS when he came with his granddaughter to see our Christmas display at the COA. He had been toying with the idea for a garden RR layout at the side of his house. That day

he spoke with club members and decided to join them. He played around a little bit with HO and N and O during the pandemic for his granddaughter but his interest in G grew out of viewing Disney's layout and the one at Longwood Gardens.

He found our auction meeting really interesting. For \$40 he bid on and won a Bachmann starter train set but the weight was broken off inside the engine. After fixing it he decided to

make the engine battery powered. "Battery power is easier in G scale rather than O." Just this past week end he made it remote and battery powered. The new remote he purchased is a much simpler remote to operate but with more sophisticated features that the original. Company is called G Scale Graphics and it is the Rail Boss Four, with a transmitter and receiver. Very impressed, the whole thing was under \$250. The train is now set up temporarily in his den.

This weekend he will be putting down an outdoor plywood base to start the layout in his yard on the side of the house. Shaped like eyeglasses, 30' long and 8' wide with 2 tracks going around with cross overs. He already has some brass and some steel track which will all be spray painted with rust oleum. Then he plans to spread gravel around to look like a roadbed. An estimate is that he will need at least 230'. Art likes all trains but this layout will be around the late 1930s pre WWII, with steam and a some diesel. Late 1800s he finds too limited. He already owns a couple of period model cars too that will be placed on the completed layout. He bought one building at the auction but as the track layout develops he will then will decide what to do as far as more buildings. Maybe adding some over under track and/or mountains first.


