View From The Cab

Look on the bright side, summer is on the way. Look at it this way, by the time you read this December issue we will have passed the shortest day of the year. Days get longer. We can only hope to get out an early spring with longer days and warmer temperatures. Just a thought!



Well if you missed our holiday brunch you missed a very pleasant afternoon at the Snapper Inn. Weather was great, clear, and not cold for December. Our buffet was simpler. Three choices of entrees, all delicious. We were in the same location as in the past, only fewer members were present. 26, usually it's 45-50 before COVID. The buffet was only for our group and set up in our area so we didn't have to walk to the other end of a large room.

In December we have two club events going at the same time. One at Old Bethpage Village (evening indoor display) a first for us. Currently we have 5 tracks with only 4 running. Two are small circles like we had at Sayille in the past. Two are on table top and the third was to be a trolley going back and forth, however, after working on back and forth for over two hours we gave up. and will leave the trolley as a static display.

The second show is at the Cradle of Aviation. There we will have 2 or more new modular displays. One will be a bridge modeled after the Hell's Gate Bridge, connecting LI to the mainland. The second bridge will blow you away. It is a lift bridge. Remember how we had to crawl under the old bridge when it wasn't raised? Well the lift bridge, when in an "up" position raises high enough so that I can walk under and I am 5' 10". I have seen parts of it and last evening I was at Tom's house and was given a demo. This is a piece of engineering and high quality workmanship. It is the combined effort of a few number of club members. excluding myself. A number of parts were made using a 3D printer. The structure is made of aluminum angle and aluminum sheet metal, held together with small nuts and screws, 2-56 or smaller. Currently the team is fine tuning movement up and down. A few of the 3D parts have to be revised and re printed. When at the Cradle, guaranteed it will be a show-stopper.

Just talking with a few of the team members I guestimate, over 300 man hours have been put into this project so far. Hopefully when the bridge is complete and operating, someone on the team will do a write up on its construction and all the time that went into the building in more detail that I just did. I have word that there is national interest in this future article to be written. (attracted the attention of the National eNewsletter)

This fall I am way behind in our fall clean up around the back yard because of other, more important, family commitments. Therefore, once again, the railroad suffers. The only hope is a mild winter and the ground doesn't freeze. On my part wishful thinking.







Member Anthony Marino has been very active in the club since joining. He is responsible for a number of short vide-

When he was a little boy his grandparents had an apartment in Manhattan right next to the NY Central EL line. He used to sit by the window when visiting them and watch the trains all day long. Both he and his brother set up an HO train layout every year for Christmas and Anthony has been doing it ever since. They also eventually added a Lionel display as well. Final-

ly he decided that he had run out of space in his house and so he purchased a large scale layout to erect in his back yard. He was at a flea market in Bellmore 3 years ago and a vendor had an entire LGB layout for sale. Although it was located in Connecticut it included trains, buildings and tracks (also switches). They were all European so he sold most of the engines and other rolling stock and used the profits to purchase USA trains.

While visiting Trainland the staff suggested that he contact the LIGRS and join our club. He likes to collect trains from the transition period from steam to diesel. His outdoor layout construction began last weekend in the middle of the night. It will be his Christmas display for this year. As all the buildings are plastic they should be fine. He is still getting the LED holiday lights that will go on automatically when it gets dark every evening. He will be able to see it from his porch where he sits every night. He has all the gravel down and has started constructing the mountain. He even has a snow plow and three

battery operated locos.

The track as shown in the photo is behind the garage but will eventually go over his existing pond and then elevate at a 2% grade up to a 2 foot raised larger section around the rest of the fencing in the back yard. He plans to build that section on a water tight deck with storage underneath to store his trains. His garage will continue to be usable as a workspace.
