SMOKE N' CINDERS

View From The Cab



I can't believe January is gone and February is here. You know what this means? It's Auction time of the year. So far it looks like we are going to have a busy year with public displays, so please look at the calendar of events posted in this and future Smoke n; Cinders. As of this writing we do not have confirmation of the Boy Scout show in Westbury, or of Planting Fields. We are doing Bayard Cutting on June 6th & 7th this could also run into the evening as Bayard has events planned in the evening. I believe this is a Saturday run day. Our Board of Directors (BOD) approved doing Mount Sinai Yacht Club (MSYC) with no date chosen as yet, most likely in July. This is a table top display. Hopefully we will have these dates to publish in the March Smoke n' Cinders (SnC).

At our January meeting, member Steve Gittleman told those present about his Railroad Operating Sessions. His railroad has 5 operating sessions per year on his approximately 2,000 foot long railroad. Running trains on his system includes trains climbing a 3% grade and going over a helix. The train consists of 20 ore cars filled with stone. They are

pulled by 4 locomotives and 1 pusher. This reminds me of a train Kathleen and I saw in Stevenson, Washington along the Columbia River. We were walking to town as a freight train approach the grade crossing. We had to wait until the train passed and what train it was! Pulled by two enormous engines, about mid train there were two more engines and after 126 cars there were again two more engines pushing at the end of the consist. Steve's railroad is operated with manual block rule with train dispatch. I believe he said radio communication was used due to the large distance over which trains are operating. Engines are battery powered using AirWire remote control. There is no responsibility for any damage that occurs during operation.



Any member interested in participating in one of the Operating Sessions please contact Steve at <u>steve@mktginc.com</u>. For those that cannot be at Steve's operating session, he is scheduled to host a meeting this year (date and tie has not been finalized). Again keep an eye on the SnC calendar of everts.

There were two other issues mentioned at the January meeting that I believe has to be mentioned here again. First, when members attend our public displays they should have on at least one article of clothing or an official club ID pin which will distinguish them as club members and not part of the general public! Second, is to get out and talk to the public. So many times a large percentage of members sit behind the

> layouts. This is most important at outdoor displays to get out with the public. We need help watching for little hands which seem to want to "pet" the trains as they go by. To those that do go out and talk, I thank you for doing a great job. One observation I made, one of our junior members is out talking to the public the moment he shows up. He loves the

trains, and shows that enthusiasm when talking with the public.

Once again, our February meeting is also our great auction day. So bring trains and more importantly money to buy trains. See you all at the February meeting.


President Mike Kmeth ask that club members remember to try and wear Club Clothing at all events such as Name tags, Shirts or Hats so people know who the members are at these events.

Any amount over will help provide refreshments at the Memorial Service in May, date to be announced.



Some auction items may be offered as lots which consist of multiples of the same or related items (e.g. track, switches, same road name passenger cars, etc.) offered from the same seller. The winning bidder will have the option to purchase one or more of the items at their winning bid price. In the event the winning bidder does not purchase the entire lot, the runner-up bidder will be offered the remaining items in the lot at the runner-up bid price. In the event the runner-up bidder declines any or all of the remaining lot, the remaining items will be up for re-bidding. This procedure will be observed in order to facilitate auction timeliness as well as provide the most equitable price to the seller. The difference between the winning bid and runner-up bid is in effect a premium for the winning bidder to select which items of the lot that they wish to purchase. 'Like items' from different sellers will be offered as separate items

The locomotive then stopped, acting as an anchor, while the train was gradually drawn forward by the electrically-powered reel.


