

View From The Cab




To all our members and their families, a happy and a healthy New Year!

I would like to give a little summary of our last few shows for 2018 for those members that weren't there for set up or run days. On December 14th we set up a table top display at Clark Botanic Garden. It had 5 tracks operating, consisting of 2 elevated small circles, 1 point to point for the trolley and 2 table top circles. The LIGRS sets up the track and ran the trains. Clark supplied all of the buildings and figures. We had a good turnout of crew for set up. A little weak on run days. Sunday, the first day of running, it rained and rained. Surprisingly the turnout of the public was not bad. As you know the club runs a raffle to promote the hobby and to raise funds. 




Directions to the Northport Yacht Club

2019 Dues Reminder


