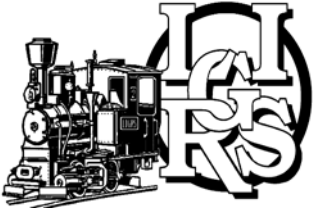

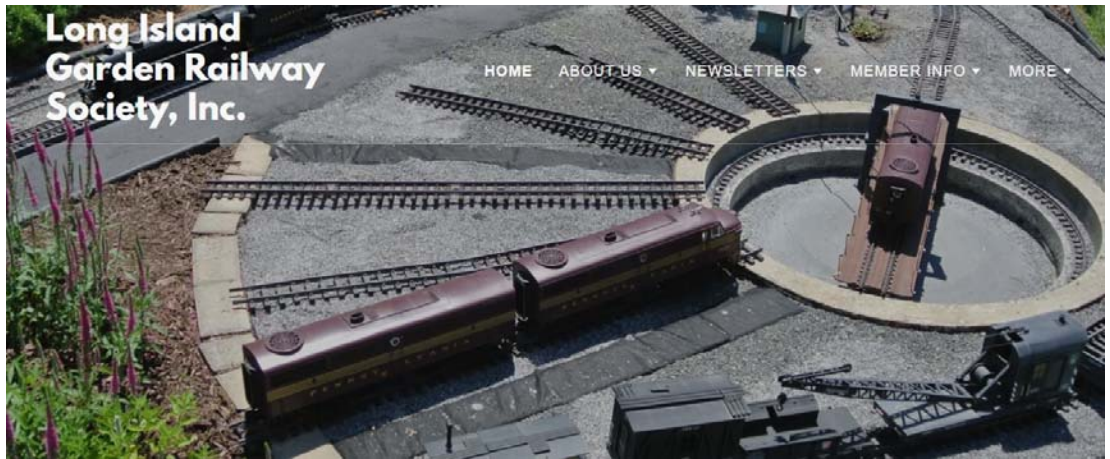

View From The Cab



I can't believe another month has gone by since I last wrote View from the Cab. Time flies when you are working on train projects. Currently I am working on 2 buildings. A firehouse, which is made up from a box of pieces that I bought a while ago and the other building is a church. Both are coming along nicely. The firehouse building is done with only the roof and lighting to be installed. However, the big project left is the doors for the fire equipment to move in and out. The doors are made of mahogany. I am in the process of machining out pockets for windows and lower panels. The windows come from a Pola kit's engine house doors. I carefully cut the window sections from the plastic doors using a Dremel, fine-tooth saw blade. They came out great. On the church I combined 2 churches to make one. Again that building is done. Currently I am working on the steeple. I am building a taller steeple using cannibalized parts from the 2 churches. I just finished building 3 windows from the steeple. Each window has an arched top. A little challenging to build but I must say they came out great.



Hopefully in the next View from the Cab I will have some pictures to show.

Well this morning, June 29th I had planned on continuing the above work, however, when I looked out on our fish pond, which I do every morning, as it is located off of our patio, I noticed that the water level had dropped 8 inches, way too much. I said to myself, "What is going on?" It is not the liner. That's one piece. All the filters are in the water (Sometimes the raccoons pull them out). Then I noticed water shooting out from the piping around the ultra-lite filter. There is one 6' piece of plastic section that had cracked last year. I had repaired it. It was fine all last season through March this year. I can't buy the replacement part. They don't make it anymore. I can buy a solid color piece, but I need the clear, because it's the only way I can see that the ultra-lite is on. Well guess what I spent the rest of the day doing? I proceeded to take the pipe I needed to repair out of the system and applied Fiberglas to the cracked area. Two and a half hours later I installed the part and turned the pump on. Well, it

still leaked! I had to start all over again. Good thing I didn't put the Fiberglas kit away. Again, after 2 ½ hours I installed the repaired part. I tried again. So far so good. We'll see in the morning how well it's working.

Update, the repair made it through the night.

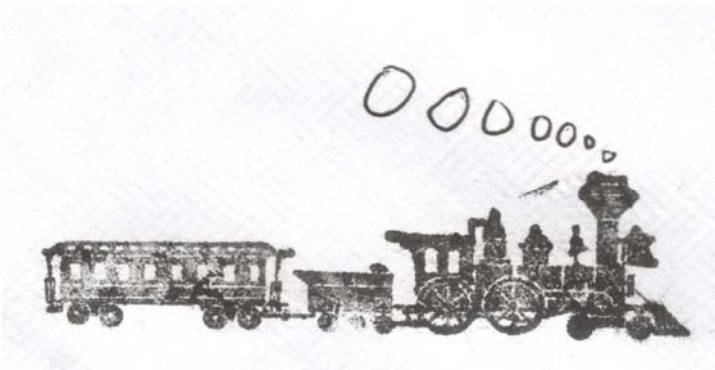

The Freeman Railway does have weeds but most are dead because of the dry spell. All the buildings are in storage. Sometime in the next week or 2 Frank and I will go to Riverhead to do some cleanup.

The September club meeting and other events are up in the air. We are hoping for an in person meeting in September. Stay tuned. As of this date, no word on public events. I will give you a word as soon as I find out.

I hope this View from the Cab is out before July 6th which is the drop dead date for signing up for our Zoom club meeting. So far the feedback has been very disappointing. We have 2 out of state persons and 2 new member families plus the BOD. The club is trying to stay in touch with all members but without your help I cannot do it alone. 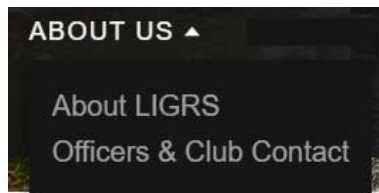

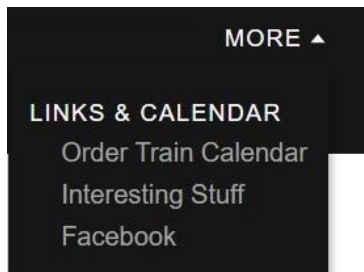
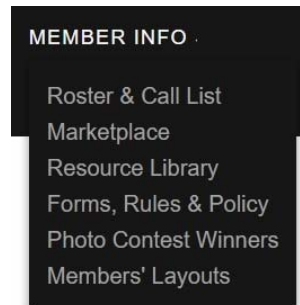
Scrolling down on the home page displays updates on recent events as well as a link to our show schedules for this and the coming year.



The drop down connected to "About Us" directs viewers to our mission statement, address and a list of our current officers and club contact person.

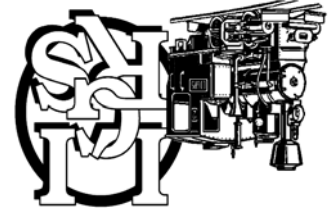
Newsletters from this and last year may be viewed and/or downloaded from that tab.

The Member Info drop down is self explanatory. Roster & Call List are still password protected using the same password from the old website. (call Mike or Tom if you have forgotten it).



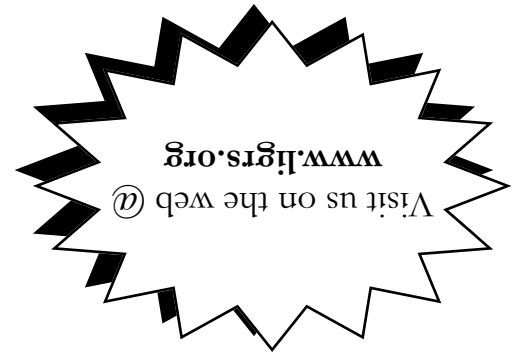

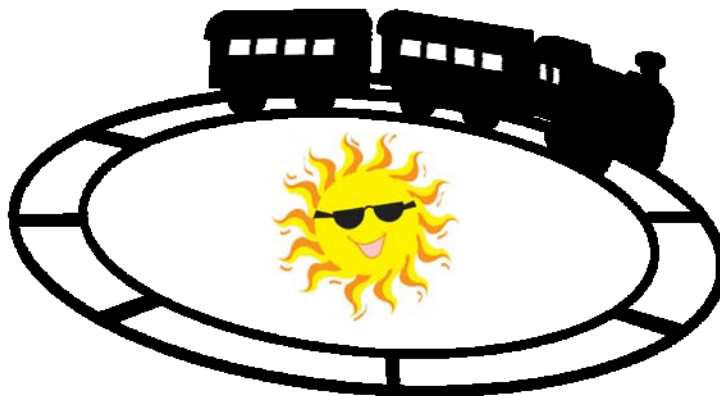
