Membership Director: The primary responsibility of the Membership Director is the continued recruitment of new members. The Membership Director is the primary contact with prospective members, to determine their interest in LIGRS and its activities, and is responsible for providing new members with membership cards, name tags and a copy of LIGRS roster and By-Laws in accordance with the LIGRS Publication Distribution Policy. Motion to close the meeting was made by Tom Rizzo seconded by Chip Sulsenti at 12:25pm.



# 2021 (2020) National Convention In Nashville



The 2020 National Garden Railway Convention was FINALLY held during the first week of June 2021. The convention attendance of both attendees and vendors gets smaller and smaller while the age gets older and older. I spoke with

Star Hobby and this is a concern. It was good to see USA Trains there as well as PIKO. A new company named Scaled Automation was showing their newly developed train/layout control systems. For the first time in recent memory, Just Plain Folk John Schneider wasn't in attendance and that left a big gap in figure availability.

I bought a vendor table in order to sell off some of my collection and sold 99% of what I brought. I let my wife price most items as she has no idea of their value. So a Bachmann Shay with upgrade trucks and Phoenix sound sold for \$150. A Piko Southern Mogul with sound and smoke sold for \$250. One attendee said that the prices were way too low. I countered with, "If I died tomorrow, who do you think would be pricing this stuff?" I have learned that if you want to get rid of stuff so as not to burden your family, you had better come to the mindset that you're not going to make your money back and you have to let it go. Else, it will go later one way or the other!

At one of our Trainfests, I purchased a 7/8

three truck Shay from one of our members. I fully intended to complete the project but, like so many "plans", this one fell through. I am happy to report that Nancy Norris, the horticulture columnist for Garden Railways, fell in love with it and purchased it for the same amount I paid for it. Thus our club member made TWO people, seller and buyer, very happy!

Hosting a convention is a thankless job and I don't mean this as a criticism of the Nashville club. They went above and beyond to make everyone welcome and did a wonderful job. My one negative was that it was held in the 2,800 room Gaylord Opryland hotel. This place is HUGE! Convention rates were \$202 a night with parking at \$30 per night (although convention attendees only paid \$10 per night). However the sheer size means a LOT of walking from rooms, to restaurants to Convention Halls and to the Vendor Hall which, oddly, was not physically attached to the hotel and required a walk outdoors to reach. On day #2 my Garmin recorded that I walked 8 miles! This is not conducive to the general age of attendees. There was a 1,500 person religious convention as well as the Self Storage Organization attending at the same time. I much prefer a convention hotel where most of the people are from the garden railway group. It becomes a lot more personable when walking the hallways, eating at a restaurant or just seeing people in the lobby when it is "people like us". This hotel was just TOO BIG!

I did not get to visit any

layouts or attend any clinics (a first for me). The additional evening activities consisted of the Jackson Riverboat dinner and show which was EXCELLENT. The Wildhorse Saloon BBQ buffet and line dancing in downtown Nashville, where they are still recovering from the bomb damage earlier this year, was noisy and crowded with regular customers. Not a favorite activity of mine.

Next year the convention is held in Denver and the following year in the Bay Area. Both groups have put on conventions before and, having attended both, I am considering attending as a conventioneer not as a vendor!

Getting out and about after a "year off" was a great start to renewing life and rekindling an interest in the greatest hobby in the world






