While visiting our family in NC, as we do a few times a year, we finally did something we've been trying to do on each visit, this time we did it, ride on The Great Smoky Mountains Railroad, (standard gauge). We had 13 family members, 3 seniors, 5 adults, and 5 children from 6-12, all had a great time, and they all want to go on another ride again in the future.

We took the Nantahala River Excursion ride. When we booked the ride we booked an open air gondola car which had a roof, good choice, everybody in our group moved around freely. We also bought box lunches when booking and ate on the train while viewing the beautiful scenery along the way. There is another excursion to take in the future which is Tuchasgee River Excursion; this one travels through an 800 Ft. long tunnel. Our train rode alongside the Nantahala River, only a few feet above the river. We even viewed kayakers

Our train was pulled by double headed Diesels, (they also run steam) I didn't count the number of couches, however they made an announcement that our train had over 600 passengers on board. Back in Brysen City our starting and end point, there is a train museum of toy trains all sizes Z up to G. They had an O gage running layout, as well as 1,000's of all scale trains on display. I have never seen so many trains in a museum as this place had, wish I had more time. There was one train that caught my eye, the Buddy L Garden Railway. It seems that the train was made in the 1930's and was not powered, you

Chic Chat Corner


Just thinking about all the activities available at the Railroad Museum of Long Island at Riverhead on the day of our club picnic.




