Fair project.


Club picnic, we are moving ahead, we have word that the LILS will be opening July 11th. Please watch your e-mails and July Smoke n' Cinders for updates.

It may be a little early but think







My Newest Project

I've always considered Model Railroading a great hobby because it covers a wide range of railroad related areas of interest and pursuit. One could be a modeler of a specific historical era, motive power (steam, diesel or electric), a particular rail line, gauge (standard or one of the various narrow gauges), industry (lumber or mining), freight, passenger or both), not to mention structures, bridges, trestles and the like. Then there are dioramas and photography not to mention electronic sounds, animation and controls as well as armchair railroading via books, videos and railfanning.

My own interests have spanned the aforementioned list of interests and pursuits. Currently I am finally making some progress on a long held aspiration to put together a LIRR passenger consist which was recently reignited by coming across an internet item about the LIRR "Sunrise Special" parlor car service that operated a century ago. I've decided to create my own version of the "Sunrise Special" to include an observation, lounge cars, a combine as well as a baggage/RPO (Railway Post Office). While I'm not sure the real "Sunrise Special" actually included a

combine, baggage or RPO, although logically they should have. I've decided to use artistic license to include them in my version of the "Sunrise Special" with an emphasis on local native American heritage as well as similar, although not prototype, engines to power the consist.

As part of this endeavor, I've been browsing the internet looking for some ideas for my baggage/RPO. I've learned some interesting facts about RPO's in general as well as LIRR RPOs. I've always thought that the RPO postmarking would indicate the railroad, date and RPO cancellation mark. I have come to realize the cancellation postmark included the origin and destination of the train, not the railroad and often included the train number. There seems to be a segment of stamp collecting specializing in RPO and HPO (Highway Post Office) covers (postcards and envelopes). Apparently the U S Post Office created HPO busses that acted as Highway Post Offices with the decline in rail passenger trains performing the same postal functions as RPOs with the exception of "on the fly" snatching of mail bags, a fascinating sight to see. Also discovered that RPO

workers had their own lingo like "throw the bums out". They were not disgruntled Brook-

lyn Dodger fans, but referring to tossing out a mail bag ("bum") at a designated location. The LIRR had several RPOs operating from Port Jefferson, Greenport as well as Montauk. I came across an interesting photo showing the LIRR RDCs pulling a RPO between Babylon and Patchogue. Other interesting photos were of LIRR MPBM54s (Motorized (electrified), Passenger, Baggage, Mail, car length), roughly 1/2 coach, 1/4 RPO, 1/4 baggage. There are two LIRR Baggage/RPO cars located at RMLI's Riverhead site although they are in rough exterior condition and are used for storage and workshop purposes. For more RPO related historical information please refer to the LIRR RPOs And Post Office Museum entries located on the LIGRS.org website under the tab MORE and sub-tab Interesting Things.




