

50/50 drawing was won by Geri Cooney \$7 for her and \$7 for the club.


Our next meeting is Sunday June 23 @ Dan Saporito's house.

Meeting was held at Mike Kmeth's house.

President Mike Kmeth asked that the meeting be opened @ 10:10 AM. A motion was made by Nick Guarino and seconded by Tom Rizzo.

President Mike Kmeth asked for a motion to forgo the reading and approve the minutes of the January 18, 2019 BOD. Nick Guarino made a motion to accept the minutes as written, seconded by Tom Rizzo, BOD approved.




