#### View From the Cab

Summer is nearly over, September 21/22, hot and humid it was.

Well for those that missed our annual picnic, you missed a great time. Weather wise, this summer was not a pleasant one; however the day of the picnic was a number 10 day. Before I continue, I have to take a moment to thank all that helped with the picnic, the planning, buying of food, cooking and serving. You did a wonderful job. I know I worked with the cooking crew. Everything went like clockwork, very smoothly. There were a lot less attending this year's picnic, including the

LILS, we had about 80, as compared with last year's 120. There was no waiting for trains, in fact, at times, the trains were waiting for passengers.

Another great event many club members missed was Rail Fest in Riverhead, at the Railroad museum of Long Island. The Freeman Rail Road looked good after the last cleanup and wall repair. The wall looks great. Again thanks

to those members that made the wall repair. Good job, well done.

This time we were blessed with two number 10 days together. As anyone that has been at Rail Fest in the past knows it can be very unpleasant in the sun all day. This year, the museum placed a larger tarp over the picnic table area. This helped quite a bit. The only down side is the bees. As you know, we always have doughnuts, besides our members enjoying them, somehow the bees also enjoy the doughnuts. Next year we will have to find a solution.

There were a few neat surprises at Rail Fest. As I wrote in an earlier View from the Cab article, the museum has a narrow gauge Porter steam engine that they hoped someday would be running. Well, this year they nearly made it. The engine is mounted on roller wheels, which in turn are mounted on a flatbed trailer. This year they were

to fire it up with a wood fire, but for some reason they had some technical problems. However, they hooked the boiler to an air compressor. With this they were able to turn wheels and blow the whistle with the compressed air. The whistle was loud, but sounded cool. I could just picture that sound echoing in the mountains of Colorado.

The second surprise was from the East Hampton Fire Department. It was a 1909 Nott steam engine pumper mounted on a 1919 American LaFrance motorized gasoline tractor. Again, this

time, the East Hampton group could not get the coal fire going to get enough steam pressure up to run the steam pumps. They got plenty of smoke up. Most of the smoke blew over to our area. The only good outcome that we noticed is every time we got a blast of smoke the bees would disappear. Membership turnout was good. However, we could have had more mem-


bers bring their trains to run.






#### **Trains in the Garden Presentation**




