
MEMBERSHIP APPROVES NEW STANDING COMMITTEE

During the general membership meeting on May 3, LWAAAC members, upon a recommendation by the board of directors, approved the establishment of a new standing committee: the technology committee. Accordingly:

The technology committee shall provide short- and long-range planning for all technology initiatives: innovation, vision, goals, program objectives/strategies/activities, infrastructure, evaluation, budgeting, and collaboration with others. The committee shall maintain the organization's websites, event calendars, email accounts, and cloud storage.

The committee shall adhere to the guidelines in the manual, "Policies and Procedures for Standing Committees," adopted by the board. The committee shall submit an estimated annual budget to the budget committee and submit all funding requirements for each proposed activity to the budget for recommendation to the board.

Luis Alomar was appointed to chair the technology committee. Alomar headed the web development group that brought the new LWAAAC website, lwaaac.com, to fruition.

Every day a telephone call will be placed to a participant at a regularly scheduled time. These calls will take place between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. as close as possible to the one-hour time block pre-selected by the participant. If the participant does not answer their first call, two more automated calls will be made. If those calls go unanswered, an alternative person who is selected by the participant during program enrollment will be called. This could be an adult child, a neighbor, a loved one, or we will assign an alternate for you. The alternate will then be encouraged to check on the older adult program participant. The failure of the participant and alternate to answer will result in a call to your local non-emergency service. [From the Senior Call Check website]
