

Scripture Reading: Exodus 1:15-21

¹⁵ Then the king of Egypt spoke to the Hebrew midwives, of whom the name of one was Shiphrah and the name of the other Puah; ¹⁶ and he said, "When you do the duties of a midwife for the Hebrew women, and see them on the birthstools, if it is a son, then you shall kill him; but if it is a daughter, then she shall live." ¹⁷ But the midwives feared God, and did not do as the king of Egypt commanded them, but saved the male children alive. ¹⁸ So the king of Egypt called for the midwives and said to them, "Why have you done this thing, and saved the male children alive?"

¹⁹ And the midwives said to Pharaoh, "Because the Hebrew women *are* not like the Egyptian women; for they ^[a] *are* lively and give birth before the midwives come to them."

²⁰ Therefore God dealt well with the midwives, and the people multiplied and ^[b]grew very mighty. ²¹ And so it was, because the midwives feared God, that He ^[c]provided households for them.

From The Preachers Desk: Addressing Changes In Life

Life is filled with changes. Each change varies in depth, severity, and complexity.

Some changes are good, and some are bad. Some changes are self-initiated or self-inflicted. We change jobs. We move from house to house or from town to town. We change cars, houses, and clothing styles.

Some happen without our initiation or action ---they just happen. The sudden loss of a family member comes to mind. But from a lesser and yet important view of things, losing employment, having a child grow up and then move away can be change that impacts us.

The reaction to change is something that can also be varied. Some reactions are silent, whether it is no response or the response is held close to their heart. Some responses are not so subtle. We see the reaction in action or words. We see the action in the countenance of a person. A person can carry the burden of whatever has changed in his or her life

The word of God gives us some great reminders for how we react to change and circumstances in our lives.

- 1. Philippians 4:11-13 Paul recounts how he had ups and downs, ebbs and flows, good times and bad times and yet he kept himself centered because of his faith in Christ. Verse 13 is the declaration: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."
- 2. Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 Solomon speaks throughout Ecclesiastes about life and its experiences. He speaks of it being vanity and without God, it is vanity. So, with God, those changes and moments that Solomon spoke of are easier to work through and can have purpose and meaning going forward.
- 3. Acts 8:1-4 The persecution in the early church certainly created change that was difficult. Christians were jailed. Christians were beaten. Christians were put to death. These are changes that were unexpected for sure by most; but look at how it was handled: They kept moving forward for Christ. They kept moving forward in the faith.

As we consider these passages, let us consider how we are addressing changes in our life. Do our actions honor God? Do our actions give a Godly example to those both in the faith and outside of the faith.

Let us seek God through prayer. Let us seek Christ through His actions as recorded through the written word. Let us meditate on those words and seek opportunities to do good and Godly things even during periods of change and adversity.
