

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NEGRO WOMEN (NCNW) IS AN "ORGANIZATION OF ORGANIZATIONS," COMPRISED OF 330 CAMPUS AND COMMUNITY-BASED SECTIONS AND 33 NATIONAL WOMEN'S ORGANIZATIONS THAT ENLIGHTENS, INSPIRES, AND CONNECTS MORE THAN 2,000,000 WOMEN AND MEN. ITS MISSION IS TO LEAD, ADVOCATE FOR, AND EMPOWER WOMEN OF AFRICAN DESCENT, THEIR FAMILIES, AND COMMUNITIES. IT WAS FOUNDED IN 1935 BY DR. MARY MCLEOD BETHUNE, AN INFLUENTIAL EDUCATOR AND ACTIVIST, AND FOR MORE THAN FIFTY YEARS, THE ICONIC DR. DOROTHY HEIGHT WAS PRESIDENT OF NCNW.

TODAY, THE NCNW PROGRAMS ARE GROUNDED ON A FOUNDATION OF CRITICAL CONCERNS THAT ARE NOW "NCNW PRIORITIES." OUR ORGANIZATION PROMOTES EDUCATION; ENCOURAGES ENTREPRENEURSHIP, FINANCIAL LITERACY, AND ECONOMIC STABILITY; EDUCATES WOMEN ABOUT HEALTH AND PROMOTES HEALTHCARE ACCESS AND PROMOTES CIVIC ENGAGEMENT AND ADVOCATES FOR SOUND PUBLIC POLICY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE.

THE LOCAL COMPONENT OF NCNW WAS NAMED FOR MINNIE H. GOODLOW PAGE, A DEVOTED CHRISTIAN WOMAN. SHE IS BEST REMEMBERED FOR HER DEEP FAITH IN GOD, LOVE OF PEOPLE, AND STRONG CONVICTION REGARDING THE IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER IN DAILY LIFE.

REV. SHAVON ARLINE-BRADLEY IS THE PRESIDENT AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER FOR NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NEGRO WOMEN (NCNW). DR. A. LOIS KEITH SERVES AS THE NATIONAL CHAIR FOR NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NEGRO WOMEN (NCNW) AND HAS DEDICATED MUCH OF HER LIFE TO NCNW'S MISSION.



SHIRLEY ISON-NEWSOME SPEAKER

SHIRLEY ISON-NEWSOME IS A RETIRED EDUCATOR WHO HAS SERVED IN EDUCATION FOR 40 YEARS, 38 OF THOSE IN THE DALLAS INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT IN DALLAS, TEXAS. SHE SERVED AS A PRINCIPAL AND IN VARIOUS CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION POSITIONS RETIRING AS AN AREA SUPERINTENDENT. DURING HER TENURE SHE SERVED AS MANY 'FIRSTS' IN DISD: FIRST DEAN OF INSTRUCTION: FIRST CHIEF OF STAFF: AND AS THE DEVELOPER OF MANY PROJECTS INCLUDING THE MIDDLE SCHOOL INITIATIVE WHICH REFORMED DALLAS' JUNIOR HIGHS INTO MIDDLE SCHOOLS: THE SPECIAL PROJECTS DEPARTMENT OVERSEEING THE FIRST 34 LOW PERFORMING SCHOOLS IN DALLAS AND MOVING ALL 34 TO AN ACCEPTABLE LEVEL: ON THE PLANNING COMMITTEE FOR DISD'S WORLD CLASS MAGNET SCHOOL PROGRAMS. AND SUPERVISED THEM FOR SEVERAL YEARS; ON THE PLANNING COMMITTEE FOR THE DISTRICT'S LEARNING CENTERS, AND SUPERVISED THEM FOR SEVERAL YEARS WITH SEVERAL UNDER HER LEADERSHIP BECOMING TOP RATED SCHOOLS IN THE STATE AND NATIONAL DEMONSTRATION SCHOOL SITES. AS PRINCIPAL OF HARRY STONE MIDDLE SCHOOL. THE SCHOOL WAS CITED AS ONE OF DALLAS' MOST IMPROVED SCHOOLS AND WAS FEATURED ON THE FRONT PAGE OF THE DALLAS TIMES HERALD. ONE OF TWO MAJOR DALLAS NEWSPAPERS AT THE TIME. SHE LATER SUPERVISED HARRY STONE WHEN IT WAS REVAMPED AS A MONTESSORI SCHOOL AND INITIATED WITH THE STONE ADMINISTRATION THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM AS STONE.

SHE WAS KNOWN AS A PRINCIPAL MAKER AND A PROGRAM DEVELOPER HAVING DEVELOPED AS HER LAST MAJOR PROJECT THE BARACK OBAMA MALE LEADERSHIP ACADEMY, THE FIRST ALL-MALE PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE STATE OF TEXAS. AN ACTIVE CHURCH WOMAN, SHE IS A MEMBER OF ST. LUKE 'COMMUNITY' UNITED METHODIST CHURCH, HAVING SERVED IN MANY MINISTRIES AND LEADERSHIP ROLES, INCLUDING LAY LEADER, AND DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY FACILITATOR FOR EVERY LEVEL FOR OVER 10 YEARS; AND SHE SERVES ON DISTRICT AND NORTH TEXAS CONFERENCE COMMITTEES. SHE ALSO SERVES ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THE UMW'S (UNITED METHODIST WOMEN'S) SCARRITT BENNETT CENTER IN NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE.

ACTIVE IN NUMEROUS ORGANIZATIONS AND THE RECIPIENT OF NUMEROUS AWARDS, INCLUDING THE NABSE NATIONAL HALL OF FAME OF EDUCATORS, THE LOCAL AAEAHP EDUCATORS' HALL OF FAME, THE SOUTH DALLAS WOMEN'S AND PROFESSIONAL CLUB WOMAN OF THE YEAR; THE ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA SOUTH REGIONAL CONFERENCE JULIA BROGDEN PURNELL HUMANITARIAN AWARD, THE CONGRESS OF AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMEN UNBOUGHT AND UNBOSSED AWARD, HER FOOTPRINTS WERE INSTALLED ON THE DR FREDERICK D. HAYNES III JUSTICE WALK OF FAME FOR HER TIRELESS EFFORTS FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE, NOTING THAT SHE BEGAN HER SOCIAL JUSTICE ACTIVISM AT THE AGE OF 13 PARTICIPATING IN HER HOMETOWN CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT HAVING EARNED HER BADGE OF HONOR BEING ARRESTED AT A SIT-IN AT AGE 13, AND MOST RECENTLY SHE WAS AWARDED THE LIVING LEGEND AWARD BY THE TEXAS ASSOCIATION OF BLACK EDUCATORS. THESE ARE BUT A FEW OF THE MORE THAN 150 AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS.

A GRADUATE OF INDIANA UNIVERSITY, THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISVILLE, AND THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY. A MOTHER AND GRANDMOTHER, ISON-NEWSOME IS ALSO A 50+ YEAR AND LIFE MEMBER OF ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA SORORITY, INC, AN ORGANIZATION DEDICATED TO 'SERVING ALL MANKIND', A MEMBER OF TOP LADIES OF DISTINCTION WHERE SHE SERVES AS THE DALLAS CHAPTER CHAPLAIN. ISON-NEWSOME IS ALSO A LIFE MEMBER OF SEVERAL OTHER ORGANIZATIONS INCLUDING THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NEGRO WOMEN (NCNW), BMCR, NAACP (SUBSCRIBING LIFE MEMBER), NABSE, AND SEVERAL OTHERS.

SHE CONTINUES TO BE SEMI-ACTIVE IN EDUCATION SERVING AS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR DR/NABSE, A LOCAL EDUCATIONAL ORGANIZATION.

ARTICLE XVI LITANY MARY MCLEOD BETHUNE'S LEGACY TO HER PEOPLE AND THE NATION

LEADER: SOMETIMES I ASK MYSELF IF I HAVE ANY OTHER LEGACY TO LEAVE. TRULY MY WORLDLY POSSESSIONS ARE FEW. YET, MY EXPERIENCES HAVE BEEN RICH. FROM THEM, I HAVE DISTILLED PRINCIPLES AND POLICIES IN WHICH I BELIEVE FIRMLY, FOR THEY REPRESENT THE MEANING OF MY LIFE'S WORK. THEY ARE THE PRODUCTS OF MUCH SWEAT AND SORROW. PERHAPS, IN THEM THERE IS SOMETHING OF VALUE. SO, AS MY LIFE DRAWS TO A CLOSE, I WILL PASS THEM ON TO NEGROES EVERYWHERE IN THE HOPE THAT AN OLD WOMAN'S PHILOSOPHY MAY GIVE THEM INSPIRATION. HERE THEN, IS MY LEGACY.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU LOVE.

RESPONSE: LOVE BUILDS, IT IS POSITIVE AND HELPFUL. IT IS MORE BENEFICIAL THAN HATE.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU HOPE.

RESPONSE: THE NEGRO'S GROWTH WILL BE GREAT IN THE YEARS TO COME. YESTERDAY, OUR ANCESTORS ENDURED THE

DEGRADATION OF SLAVERY, YET THEY RETAINED THEIR DIGNITY.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU THE CHALLENGE OF DEVELOPING CONFIDENCE IN ONE ANOTHER.

RESPONSE: AS LONG AS NEGROES ARE HEMMED INTO RACIAL BLOCKS OF PREJUDICE AND PRESSURE, IT WILL BE NECESSARY FOR

THEM TO BAND TOGETHER FOR ECONOMIC BETTERMENT.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU A THIRST FOR EDUCATION.

RESPONSE: KNOWLEDGE IS THE PRIME NEED OF THE HOUR.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU A RESPECT FOR THE USE OF POWER.

RESPONSE: WE LIVE IN A WORLD, WHICH RESPECTS POWER ABOVE ALL THINGS. POWER, INTELLIGENTLY DIRECTED, CAN LEAD TO

MORE FREEDOM. UNWISELY DIRECTED, IT CAN BE A DREADFUL DESTRUCTIVE FORCE.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU FAITH.

RESPONSE: FAITH IS THE FIRST FACTOR IN LIFE DEVOTED TO SERVICE. WITHOUT FAITH, NOTHING IS POSSIBLE. WITH IT, NOTHING

IS IMPOSSIBLE. FAITH IN GOD IS THE GREATEST POWER, BUT GREAT TOO, IS FAITH IN ONESELF.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU A DESIRE TO LIVE HARMONIOUSLY WITH YOUR FELLOW MAN.

RESPONSE: THE PROBLEM OF COLOR IS WORLDWIDE. IT IS FOUND IN AFRICA AND ASIA, EUROPE, AND SOUTH AMERICA. I APPEAL TO AMERICAN NEGROES – BOTH NORTH AND SOUTH, EAST AND WEST, TO RECOGNIZE THEIR COMMON PROBLEMS AND UNITE TO SOLVE THEM.

LEADER: I LEAVE YOU, FINALLY, A RESPONSIBILITY TO OUR YOUNG PEOPLE.

RESPONSE: THE WORLD AROUND US REALLY BELONGS TO THE YOUTH, FOR THE YOUTH WILL TAKE OVER ITS FUTURE MANAGEMENT. OUR CHILDREN MUST NEVER LOSE THEIR ZEAL FOR BUILDING A BETTER WORLD.

ALL: IF I HAVE A LEGACY TO LEAVE MY PEOPLE, IT IS MY PHILOSOPHY OF LIVING AND SERVING. AS I FACE TOMORROW, I AM CONTENT, FOR I THINK I HAVE SPENT MY LIFE WELL. I PRAY NOW THAT MY PHILOSOPHY MAY BE HELPFUL TO THOSE WHO SHARE MY VISION OF A WORLD OF PEACE.


