Policy Statement:

Procedures:

- 1. Risk Assessment:
 - a. NHAHA will regularly conduct risk assessments to identify potential hazards associated with our NDIS services.
 - b. Mitigation strategies will be implemented to reduce or eliminate identified risks.
- 2. Emergency Procedures:
 - a. Emergency procedures will be established and communicated to ensure the safety of all stakeholders in the event of an emergency.
