

HOW TO REPORT COVID VACCINE SIDE-EFFECTS

Not many people are aware of the UK Government's MHRA Yellow Card system for reporting adverse drug reactions. The reporting system was created in 1964 in response to the Thalidomide drug disaster

Reporting any suspected side-effects from the new Covid vaccines as soon as possible helps medical professionals and vaccine manufacturers identify safety issues early. In 2019 new products were designed and manufactured in an emergency response to the SARS-COV2 Covid outbreak. Pfizer and Moderna produced brand new injectable treatments that contain the molecular substance mRNA (messenger ribonucleic acid), which inserts coded instructions in to your DNA to synthesise spike proteins - attempting to prevent and fight symptoms of Covid. Moderna refer to their mRNA product as a 'operating system'.

mRNA vaccines have never been approved for use on humans before New vaccines often go through 10 years of research and development - including 5 stages of safety trials, before receiving a legal license to be used on the public. But in 2019 the UK Government rushed through a 'public consultation' to amend Human Medicine Regulations to support fast track roll-out of COVID-19 vaccines. This allowed 'temporary authorisation' and the 'unlicensed' approval to roll out the Pfizer, Moderna and Oxford Astra-Zeneca jabs with 'zero public liability'. Unfortunately not many people were aware of the UK GOV public consultation.

All three Covid vaccines being used in the UK are still in the 5 stages of safety trials. Therefore it is essential that every person in the UK is aware of the MHRA Yellow Card side-effects reporting system in order to protect the nation from another disaster similar to Thalidomide, which was only given to pregnant women for morning sickness in 1964. Covid vaccines are being injected in to the whole nation, so reporting side effects as soon as possible is essential.
