FOOD FOR THOUGHT

WAITING IN JOYFUL HOPE

Pierre Teilhard de Chardin was a man of hope. Indeed his whole vision of things is generally criticized for being too hopeful. So, in trying to explain hope and Advent, allow me a Teilhard story: Teilhard was a scientist, but he was also a priest and a man whose ultimate vision of things was formed by the gospels. Central to his system of thought was his rock-bottom belief that ultimately all of history, cosmic and human, would come together in Christ into one community of life and love. Yet he was surrounded by colleagues, both Christian and secular, who had a far less hopeful view of things. One day he was challenged this way: "You have an enchanted view of history, believing that everything will one day culminate in a wonderful 'kingdom' of peace and love, but suppose we blow up the world in a nuclear war? What happens to your schema of things then?"

His response to that question is a textbook definition of hope: "If we blow up the world it will be a great tragedy because it will set things back millions of years. But history will still culminate one day in a kingdom of peace and love—not because my theory says so, but because God promised it. In the resurrection God has shown the power to bring this about, despite the things we do."

That's hope, to be able to say, "It might take a million years or longer, but it will happen because God promised it." We, like Teilhard, should be prepared to live in great patience as we wait for God to fulfill his promise. —Fr. Ron Rolheiser, OMI

A STATEMENT FROM THE CCCB ON THE NON-PERMISSIBILITY OF MAID IN HEALTH ORGANIZATIONS WITH A CATHOLIC IDENTITY

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) has released a statement regarding the non-permissibility of MAiD in Catholic Health organizations. "Euthanasia and assisted suicide (MAiD) have always been, and will always be, morally unacceptable because they are affronts to human dignity and violations of natural and divine law. Catholic healthcare affirms that every person, made in the image of God (cf. Gen 1:26), has intrinsic value, regardless of ability or health."

In their statement, they lay out the Catholic position of compassionate and high-quality palliative care, the timely access of which can reduce suffering and attend to patients' spiritual and psychological needs. The CCCB offers "Horizons of Hope" as a tool to assist Catholic communities with this compassionate work: https://www.cccb.ca/faith-moral-issues/suffering-and-end-of-life/horizons-of-hope-a-toolkit-for-catholic-parishes-on-palliative-care/

The CCCB "oppose any efforts by governments or others to compel such facilities to perform MAiD in violation of Catholic teachings."

Yes, Lord, we entrust ourselves to the intercession of your mother and your grandmother, because mothers and grandmothers help to heal the wounds of our hearts."


