- Primary Care provides primary and preventative care to adults, ages 18 and up. Prospective patients must qualify financially and medically
- The Diabetes Care and Education Program
- The Women's Health Initiative makes sure gynecological care becomes part of the follow-up care for women who have not had recent examinations and/or are determined through the primary care checkup to require additional care
- Chronic Disease Management helps patients manage chronic conditions, such as high cholesterol, high blood pressure, obesity and overweight
- Sick visits for patients only
- Immunizations
- Nutrition coaching
- Counseling

Eligibility

- One must live in Bergen County, working and earning up to 250% of Federal Poverty Guidelines, does not have health insurance, does not qualify for Medicaid or Medicare, and does not qualify for subsidized healthcare
- To become a patient, make an appointment by calling the main number
- Does not treat children
- Interpreters are available for those who do not speak English

Programs and Services

- Available to homeless families if there is a lack in fixed and adequate nighttime residence.
- **Operation Child Care** - offers a few hours of free childcare for the National Guard and Reserve members who are returning home from Operation Iraqi Freedom or Operation Enduring Freedom.
- **Grow NJ Kids** - creates universal standards of quality for all early care and education programs throughout New Jersey.
- **New Jersey Cares for Kids (NJCK)** subsidizes childcare costs for low and moderate income families. Appointment only.
- **Work First New Jersey** participants are eligible for childcare subsidy assistance if they need childcare to work, look for work, or participate in an approved work activity. To determine eligibility, contact the Bergen County Board of Social Services at 201-368-4200.

Eligibility

- Parents applying for the Child Care Subsidy Program are required to provide proof of income, training/school hours and household size. Parents must be a New Jersey resident and meet income requirements. Parents must be working full time, attending school full time with 12+ credits, or in job training at least 20 hours a week.
- Children up to the age of 13 or less than the age of 19, if under the NJ Division of Child Protection and Permanency's protective supervision or mentally or physically incapable of self-care, are eligible for subsidy. The child must be a US citizen or a qualified non-citizen. The child must reside with parent(s), or individual(s) acting as parent(s).

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

WIC provides federal grants to states for supplemental foods, health care referrals, and nutrition education for low-income pregnant, breastfeeding, and non-breastfeeding postpartum women, as well as infants and children up to age five who are found to be at nutritional risk

Eligibility

- **How to Apply:** Contact your local agency to set up an appointment.
- **Categorical Requirement:** Pregnant, breastfeeding, non-breastfeeding postpartum women, infants and children up to age five who are found to be at nutritional risk.
- **Residential Requirement:** Must live in the state in which you apply.
- **Income Requirement**
 - **Income standard:** The state agency's income standard must fall under the federal poverty guidelines but cannot exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty income guidelines.
 - **Automatic Income Eligibility:** income-eligible for WIC based on their participation in certain programs. These participants include individuals eligible to receive SNAP benefits, Medicaid, or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families.
- **Nutritional Risk Requirement:** Applicants must be seen by a health professional to determine whether the individual is at nutrition risk. This is often done in the WIC clinic at no cost. The information needed can also be obtained from the applicant's physician.

Alternatives to Domestic Violence is a domestic violence nonresidential intervention program that offers a comprehensive approach by providing services to individuals and families involved in an abusive relationship

- ◆ Domestic violence is not a disagreement, an anger management issue, or a normal part of an intimate relationship; it is a systematic pattern of abusive behavior with intent to gain and maintain power and control another person. Domestic violence can happen to anyone, regardless of their race, religion, age, socio-economic background, level of education, or sexual orientation. Domestic violence is a crime.

Programs and Services

- Clients include victims, abusers, and family members.
- Emergency services include danger/lethality assessments, crisis intervention services, case management, food and clothing necessities, safety planning, and more.
- Legal and financial assistance services
- Counseling Services available for batterers, non-residents, individuals, groups, families, and adolescents. Services also include peer support groups.
- Support Services include resources and referrals, goal planning assistance, parenting skills training, and onsite mental health services.
- Children's Services include youth counseling, childcare during support groups, educational and after school programs, and teen activity programs.
- Community Educational Services include domestic violence workshops.

Eligibility

- Everyone is eligible, most services do not require a fee. No one is ever turned away due to a lack of funds.

- **Assistance to the Elderly and Disabled (AED) Program** - services for older adults (60+) and disabled victims who are unable to live in the Safe House.
- **Emergency Legal Services for Victims of Domestic Violence** - assists survivors of domestic violence in family law matters.

- **Interment:** Veterans who were honorably or generally discharged from the military and have passed away may be interred in the Brigadier General William C. Doyle Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Arneystown, New Jersey. Their place of rest is marked and cared for perpetually.
- **Alfred J. Thomas Home for Veterans** is transitional housing and provides support services for veterans.
- **The Bergen County Military Service Medal** is a service medal offered to all county residents, currently living or who died in the county, who have been honorably discharged from the military, or posthumously to residents who died while serving.
- **The Veterans' Honorary Service Card:** many businesses and organizations in Bergen County offer discounts to veterans with this card. It can be issued to veterans who present a copy of their military service records. Participation in any discount or amount offered will be at the sole discretion of the vendor/retailer.
- **Tracers** locate homeless veterans and connects them with community-based and VA sponsored programs and benefits in order to find them shelters, jobs, and other needed services.
