# 1st Round of the FSTF Food Pantry Sustainability Grant

In January, over \$500,000 was distributed to forty-seven food pantries in Bergen County. The grant provided funding to help food pantries meet their infrastructure needs and become more sustainable. Grantees were able to complete massive renovations, acquire new equipment, and create a better working environment for their volunteers. With this grant, more organizations are now able to accept fresh produce as many purchased new refrigerators and freezers.

# Feed the Front Lines 3rd Phase

Ridgewood's Feed the Front Lines began its 3rd phase! With the increase in need within our food-insecure population, Feed the Front Lines began supplying meals to food pantries. 12,000 ready-toeat meals were distributed to food pantries each week from September to December during the 3rd phase.

# Franciscan Community Development Center Renovation

Leveraging the FSTF Sustainability
Grant, the Franciscan Community
Development Center of Fairview, in

began their food pantry renovation in
October. The FCDC serves up to 3,000
clients each week and their facility was
in desperate need of an upgrade. Their
renovation includes a walk-in
refrigerator, additional storage, and a
complete overhaul of the current
pantry. During the renovation, FCDC
has continued serving their community.
