Dear Friends,

Well...2020 is in the books. It would be an understatement to say it was a looooooong year. For some, 2020 ranks as one of, if not *the*, most difficult years they've experienced. For others, 2020 wasn't as difficult as it was for others. Certainly, it was a different kind of year. As we head into 2021, I'd like to take a few moments to look back and reflect, and then look forward to the future.

I know....some don't want to look back at all; they'd rather toss 2020 into the trash can and leave it there. Believe it or not, though, some good things happened in 2020 that deserve to be mentioned and celebrated. So...let's celebrate three things in particular:

- 1. Massive leadership reorganization Going into 2020, our main focus and emphasis was a reorganization of our leadership structure, for the purpose of aligning ourselves better for ministry. We accomplished this! We established an Executive Leadership team that would set our goals and the things to prioritize, and ministry teams that would execute our mission of connecting people to Jesus Christ. From there, we invited our congregation to consider being a part of a ministry team and gave the opportunity for that to happen. You might remember waaaaaay back in February, we had a congregational meeting to allow our ministry team chairpersons to speak — we ended that day with 30 people committing to being on a ministry team. It was an energizing and exciting day! Then Covid hit....and the rest is history. But we're not giving up!
- 2. Expanded Digital Presence With the directives to cease in-person worship, we had to find ways to continue to connect people to Jesus. Prior to March, we were broadcasting via Facebook Live our message every Sunday. It was decided we needed to offer more than just a message, but to include music as well. So we procured the necessary licensing and began to share an entire worship service. I was, and still am, floored and the response to that. A rough calculation shows that our worship videos have had just shy of (ready for this?) 12,000 views. Now...this doesn't

necessarily mean 12,000 unique viewers (I'm guessing that number is much lower), but it does represent-in my mind-12,000 different moments for there to be a connection with God. This has happened because people have "shared" our broadcast and invited people to tune in — I fully believe there are some folks who have joined us who never had worshipped before. These numbers also don't take into account the Evening Prayer services done in the spring and early summer. I am forever grateful to Wendy McClenning, Jill Roegge, Brian DeLoche, Brittney Taylor, and Andrea Wells for being the team that has moved this engine forward. And thanks to all who have shared the broadcast or invited others to worship with them. In so many ways...we have made the gospel available to so many and only God knows the impact that has made.

**3. Spiritual Growth** — Throughout this year, I have witnessed a spiritual awakening beginning to take root in our congregation. I want to highlight two things in particular. Number 1. Is the 15 people who gathered every Wednesday in the fall to explore and unpack the Supernatural power of God through the Holy Spirit. In these times, the Spirit challenged us, provoked us, and gave us cause to think on and even wrestle with God's working in the world. Number 2. Is the response to the invitation given to read through the entire Bible in one year (with caveat to take it slower if needed). In the last month, I have had dozens of messages of folks who were committed to reading and had questions, or were sharing new insights that had been revealed. We have folks reading with us who aren't a part of our church, but because someone from our church shared a message or offered an invitation, they jumped in. I celebrate and rejoice what God has done and is continuing to do in our midst! I also remained firmly convinced that nothing moves us closer to the heart of God than engaging Scripture in a disciplined and consistent way. If you're reading this and you haven't jumped on board...it's not too late! Here's my invitation — dive in! Fix a time and start! If you need a copy of the reading plan, please let me know. I'll hand-deliver it if needed. God is up to something!

- 1. Ministry Teams In the very near future, those ministry teams that were a cause for celebration in 2020 are going to get off the ground and start planning and working on the ministry entrusted to them. first Sunday in January, our worship videos will now also be uploaded to YouTube. You can find us on YouTube at "Beardstown First UMC". If you have an account with YouTube, you will be able to subscribe to our page and receive notifications when a video is posted. Our YouTube uploads for the time being will not be live, but will be recordings of the live broadcast. Worship videos will usually be uploaded within an hour of the conclusion of worship. We hope this will provide a connection point with God to those who are not on Facebook and cannot join us there.

I was recently hit with the realization that the beginning of 2021 will mark the beginning of my fifth year as pastor of First UMC. I have expressed in other places and times how incredibly blessed and honored my family and I are to be in Beardstown and a part of this congregation. I echo all that again now! It has been a wonderful four years for us; I pray it has been for you as well. As we look to the future, I remain firmly convinced that our best, and most fruitful, days remain in front of us. I am honored to be your pastor and I am brimming with excitement at what God might do in each of us, in our congregation, and in our community. To God alone be all glory, now and forever!
