Dear Friends,

As we begin the month of March, we anticipate several "beginnings". We anticipate the end of winter's cold grasp and the (somewhat) warmer winds of spring. With that brings the anticipation of new life emerging from dormancy. If you are a baseball fan, like me, there is the anticipation of a new season. In the church, there is the anticipation of Easter and the great celebration of Christ's Resurrection. Before we get there, though, we journey through a season called Lent. Lent is a time of preparation for the celebration. In the early church, Lent was a period of intense instruction that preceded a public declaration of faith in Christ. It is a time to reflect, to renew, and to repent.

In worship over the past few weeks, we have, in subtle ways, already been preparing for Lent. You may recall we have been exploring and unpacking some events in the Gospel of John, through which Jesus reveals his identity. My hope is that we have spent some time watching what Jesus has done, and reflecting upon how Jesus might have done/be able to do the same thing in us. It is wondrous to see the work of Jesus!

As we begin Lent, though, our focus will no longer be on what Jesus does. Instead, our Lenten focus will be honing in on what Jesus *says*. To do this, we are going to be following the story of Jesus from the Gospel of Luke. More specifically, we are going to start at Luke 9:28 and work our way through the story until we reach the Empty Tomb. Along the way, we will hear Jesus teach on the way of the cross—the way that leads to everlasting life. It will not be easy; and I can promise that Jesus will say things that we would prefer he not say.


Our Lenten journey will begin atop the Mount of Transfiguration and will take the winding roads that lead to Jerusalem. Our listening to Jesus will not take place solely within the confines of our Sunday worship, though. In order to hear more completely what Jesus says, we will use a field-guide to show us the way. Each week, in the bulletin, there will be a sheet that will guide us in daily readings throughout the week, along with a few words of commentary. I encourage you to spend a few moments each day reading that day's passage and contemplating what Jesus is saying. Included in this newsletter is a day-by-day listing of the passages, but without any accompanying commentary.

Just as the ancient church had a period of intense instruction on the faith so too will we, and our instructor is none other than Jesus. So, friends, I invite us on journey; a holy journey where Jesus will teach us as much as we will allow. So...let's Listen to Him!
