Dear Friends,

Let me begin with three simple words: <u>I MISS</u> <u>YOU!!!!</u> I miss seeing you on Sunday morning. I miss worshipping with you. I miss talking face-to-face with you.

The Easter celebration is this month. I feel like, in some way, I should be writing this column about Easter—maybe I should be. I don't know. I find I've been saying "I don't know" a lot lately. Perhaps you have, as well. We find ourselves in a situation for which none of us were prepared, and many of us don't like. Our routine and our way of life has been disrupted drastically. We've been told, more than once, what we should and can do, and what we cannot or should not do. It seems, each day, I shake my head and utter those words again: I don't know. I don't know when we will be able to again worship together, in person. I don't know when, or if, our kids will get to go back to school. I don't know when the "shelter in place" order will be lifted. I don't know....a lot of things for which I had the answer. I just don't know.

BUT.... Even though I don't know a lot of things, there are some things that I DO know:

#1—I do know that this WILL end. I don't know when and I don't know how; but this will end. We will not be facing a pandemic forever. We will be able to gather together again. We will be able to go to our favorite restaurant. Our kids will be able to play their ball games and participate in their activities. We will be able to leave our home without fear of "catching something". I know this, I believe this!

#2—We will get through this together. I have marveled, over these last few weeks at how people have come together. We have stepped in to help our neighbors. I've noticed a bit more empathy and compassion from people. We've been a tad more patient with each other. I think we all realize we're in this together. Some-

thing about that brings out the best in us. I would like to think it would continue after we've weathered this storm. We shall see...

#3—I know that God still reigns. There is nothing that can take God's place. There is nothing that can supplant God as the ruler of all things. Even in the midst of anxious moments, God is still God and God is unchanging—ever-loving, ever-gracious, ever-forgiving, ever-healing, and so on. I take comfort in all this. I take comfort in knowing that God is the same now as God was before all this started, and that God will be the same tomorrow. If there is nothing else in which to place our faith, it is this truth.

I suppose the big question is, what do we in the midst of all this? I know there are "official" answers to that question, and in many cases, we can only do what the government allow us to do. But getting beyond that...what do we do now that life as we know has hit the pause button? I will confess that I've rather enjoyed having this pause. No, I'm not glad to hear to sickness and death, and I'm not glad to be missing things that been put on hold. But I am glad to simply have a bit of a break. I think it has given me a chance to focus on what is really important. One of things I've been able to focus on more and more has been my relationship with God, my spiritual journey. These times have forced to reengage my relationship with God in new ways. I found there were a few things that needed attention and sharpening. One of these things was my engagement with Scripture. I simply had not been engaging Scripture as I should. I've resolved to change that! What's more....I'd like to invite you to do it with me! In another space in this newsletter, I'll share about that invitation.

These times also present us with a challenge beyond simply getting through this. The challenge is this: what do we do when this has passed? Do we simply go back to life as it was? Do we pick up where we left off? Or do we allow these days and times to shape us going forward? I am wrestling with this same question, even as I ask it of you. The only thing I've come up with so far is...I don't know. I don't know what things will look like, but I would like to think that things will be different. As with so many things, we shall see...

I do pray you are all physically, spiritually, and emotionally well. I miss you and I can't wait to see you all again!



Christian Love In Action




