Dear Friends,

As I begin to immerse myself in the biblical stories surrounding Jesus' Resurrection, I find myself struck by something. In John 21, Jesus appears to his disciples as they are out fishing. Mind you, Jesus has already appeared to them prior to this, so they are aware that Jesus has indeed been raised from the dead. What strikes me as odd, though, is that even though they knew Jesus had been raised...they returned to their old way of life! It's as if the past few years of their lives had been some extended "vacation" and they are now picking things up where they left off before Jesus invited them to follow him. As I roll this around in my head, I am left with two conclusions. Either they 1. didn't see the Resurrection as any big deal, or 2. they didn't know what to do about it.

I wonder sometimes if that's how Easter is for us. We either don't see it as any big deal or we don't know what to do with it once it is past. My hope, certainly, is that we do not fall into that first category. The reality is this: EASTER IS A BIG DEAL!! Easter is God's way of extending new life to us and to all of Creation. The enduring Easter message is that we have been raised and given new life, just as Christ was raised and given new life...a life that is glorifying and pleasing to God. Has there ever been any more glorious news?! Christ is alive and so are you!

The challenge that Easter presents to us, though, is to make Easter matter every other day of the year. In other words, we are challenged by Christ to keep the tomb empty throughout the year. How do we do this? How do we make Easter matter? The most obvious way is to continually celebrate Easter and Resurrection. We do this every Sunday as we worship. We are Easter people and it defines and guides our worship. Perhaps you've been away from worship for awhile.


This Easter season is a great opportunity to come back...for the sake of celebrating the new life God has given each of us in Christ. In the Church, the seven weeks after Easter Day is known as the "Easter Season". During this season, we're going to be slowly walking through Paul's Letter to the Philippians, with the emphasis on returning to our first love — drinking deeply of God's love for us, and offering all that we are to God (more on that in another part of the newsletter).

As we begin to ever-so-slowly emerge from the past year, perhaps, now, more than ever, Easter is exactly what we need. We are faced now with the challenge of running as fast as we can back to the way life was, OR meeting the new day with a fresh perspective, outlook, and intentions. I don't know about you, but there are parts of pre-pandemic life I don't want to return to; I want to welcome life anew — however different it might be or look like. Maybe, just maybe, God is inviting us to venture out "into the deep", to journey with Jesus in ways we've not considered before. Maybe there's a life out there that is far better, more full of God's presence than anything we could imagine.

Friends, Easter is God's greatest gift to you, to me, to the world. It is too big of a deal and there is too much at stake for us to not allow Easter to influence and guide us. My hope and prayer for each of you this Easter is that God might make your life new again and fill you with the knowledge and joy of Resurrection and God's amazing love! From our family to yours...may your Easter be filled with love and joy



Administrative News




