One of the major questions that our society is dealing with has to do with behavior, namely the behavior of those who have been entrusted with positions of prestige or leadership—from leadership in our community all the way up to national leaders. The fancy word given to human behavior is *ethics*. It has occurred to me that there is usually a certain, but often unwritten, ethic demanded or expected of those in positions of leadership. We could probably debate the merits and fairness of that expected ethic; what is obvious, at least to me, is that as a society, we are not shy about holding others accountable for their behavior.

I think the same could be said of Christians and the Church. Our world has a certain expected ethic of those who profess to follow Christ. I grew up being instructed to "behave myself" because that's what a Christian did, and to not do so would bring shame not only upon me, but upon the Church, and, ultimately, Jesus. Again, we could probably debate the merits and fairness of this. Yet it leaves me wondering...what *does* a Christian ethic look like? What kind of behavior should a Christian exhibit?

Fortunately, that is not a question that needs to be answered all by ourselves! Jesus provides for His followers an instruction on their behavior in this world. In the Gospel of Matthew, we find an extensive teaching from Jesus concerning his followers' attitudes and behaviors. We call it the Sermon on the Mount; it is a three-chapter long teaching that Jesus gives at the beginning of his public ministry, that sets the stage for what God is going to do through Jesus.

Throughout this fall, our sermon series will be unpacking this great discourse from Jesus. Along the way, we will get a glimpse of what the Kingdom of God looks like, as well as how WE can be a part of it, right here and now. This will be heavy lifting, so we will be taking it slowly, and allowing God to shape us through these words. We will encounter some difficult teachings, but we will navigate them together. We will see that Jesus invites his followers not just into faith, but action that is grounded in faith.

The month of August usually means a return to school for our children. This year, the month of August will take us all back to school, with Jesus as our instructor. So...let's join those who took their place at the Master's feet—class is in session!


Thank you to everyone who helped with VBS this year. Your time, dedication, donations and prayers were very much appreciated. Next month I will post pictures and details from the week.


- **Old Business**: It will be OK for filers for the study lab to be included in the school registration packets.




