Dear Friends,

I love this time of year! From football games, to temperatures becoming a bit chillier, to that smoky tinge in the air, to the beginning of harvest being brought in (even though my allergies don't particularly like it!)...all of it appeal to my senses and bring a smile to my face. What really gets me, though, is the splash of color that the trees take on as the leaves begin to change and the autumn sunsets that paint the evening sky in orange, purple, and pink. To me, it is all a reminder of how wondrous and majestic God is.

As I think about God, it is no surprise to me that the very first story of Scripture is the story of Creation, namely Creation as solely the work of God and how it declares the glory and wonder of God. Have you ever taken a few moments to simply be in awe and wonder of God? Even as I write this, I can't help but hear our congregation singing the beloved hymn, "then sings my soul, my Savior God to thee; how great thou art, how great thou art." Truly God is great and awesome and majestic! Creation sings the glory of God, and we are invited to join in that hymn, praising our God simply for who and what God is. If you haven't had a chance to lately, I want to invite you to take just a few moments and reflect upon and bask in the greatness and wonder of our God.

What makes the Creation story even more amazing, to me, is that the story doesn't stop simply with the glory and wonder of God. Genesis 2 places great emphasis on the creation of human beings, and the special place in God's heart for the human creation.

What's more, within the heart of God is a special place for each individual person! This is because each of us is formed and fashioned in the image of God; we are each a reflection of our Creator. It is almost overwhelming to think that the Lord of all Creation would care to even know who we are as individuals, yet the Psalmist declares "You search me and know me...You knit me together in my mother's womb...I am fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139). We are not just a part of God's glorious creation, but we are known and loved beyond belief by the God who formed us in God's own image!

The Creation story is one that, for many of us, might be so familiar that we could quote it, or at least explain the basics of it with little help from Scripture. But it is a story that is more than just the beginning of Scripture. It is a story that declares the glory and wonder of God and our place, as human beings, in God's heart and life. Let us never forget, indeed, let us remind ourselves again and again, of the greatness and glory of our God...and let us sing for joy and thanksgiving this song by contemporary Christian band Third Day:

Lord of all creation, of water, earth, and sky, The heavens are Your tabernacle, Glory to the Lord on high

God of wonders, beyond our galaxy You are holy, holy The universe declares your majesty You are holy, holy

Explorer's Bible Study




