Guides

 Guides are essential to nurture and support the students throughout the day. They are dedicated to developing strong relationships and truly knowing each student. This role requires an empathic attitude and the ability to compassionately connect with each student. Guides are a positive role model for students and are engaged in learning in each Area of Interest alongside the Educators and students. In addition, the Guide acts as support to the Educator along with demonstrating curiosity and wonder. The Guide is readily available to step in as needed.

• Educators

 Educators are responsible for the planning and preparing of hands-on lessons and leading the group with the assistance of the Guides. Lessons should be engaging and well defined prior to the class within their Area of Interest. The lesson is intentional and provides a meaningful experience for the students. This role requires thoughtful preparation outside the contracted hours.
