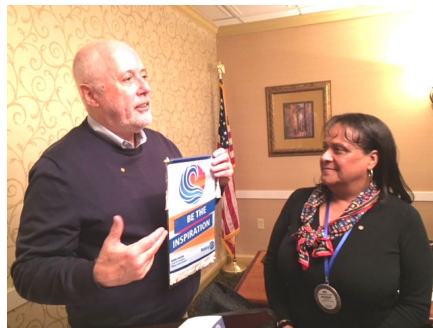
Dec. 6 Meeting to Information About Pathstone
