The Bridgeton City Park Pedestrian Bridge Project is the final phase of a project to restore the wooden catwalks (wooden walking paths) in Bridgeton City Park. Now, the Bridgeton Area Chamber of Commerce Foundation and Bridgeton Rotary Club Foundation are joining forces to raise funds to rebuild two bridges that will allow residents and visitors to walk from downtown Bridgeton, through Bridgeton City Park to Sunset Lake, across Barretts Run to Piney Point, part of Bridgeton City Park located in Hopewell Township, and eventually through the new Hopewell Township Park to Rt. 49. The project's estimated cost is \$20,000 and should be completed this winter. The bridges will be ADA accessible and will become the permanent property of the City of Bridgeton. If donations exceed the cost of this bridge project, the Foundations will use those funds to support other community projects and donations. Your support is appreciated.

The Chamber and Rotary view this as more than a construction project. It is a community project that will:

- *encourage walking to improve community health*
- *attract more visitors to the park and area to boost the economy*
- *highlight and build respect for the eco-system in the area*
- *bring people together by connecting two communities, Hopewell and Bridgeton.*
