August 15, 2019: Romaine Street Gives Classification Talk

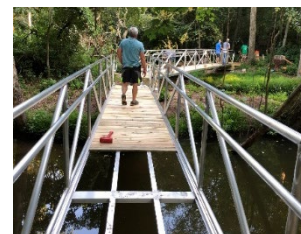

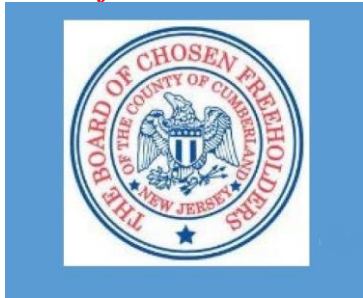

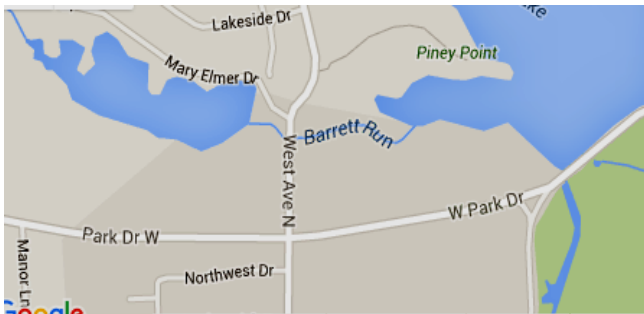
