Rob Weinstein Explained Where All



the Employees Went

On July 29, the Bridgeton Rotary Club meeting featured a presentation by fellow club member Dr. Robin Weinstein, Chair of HR Studies at Wilmington University. Rob provided an overview of the various causes of the employee shortages including pre-pandemic employment trends and pandemic economic policies that are major influencers on the post-pandemic staffing crisis. He suggested some ways that employers could address their current staffing needs. He offered statistics that indicate employees are looking for better pay and benefits but also more flexibility in hours and working conditions. When many employees return to

the workforce after COVID-19 unemployment and as others currently employed seek new jobs, employers should be prepared to compete as the pool of qualified employees is shrinking and competition is now not just other area businesses but people are willing to work anywhere nationally and globally. This statistic indicated that there will be more employees looking for jobs soon. "A separate February 2021 report found that 52 percent of 2,000 employees surveyed in the U.S. and Canada plan to look for a new job in 2021, an increase from 35 percent a year earlier.
