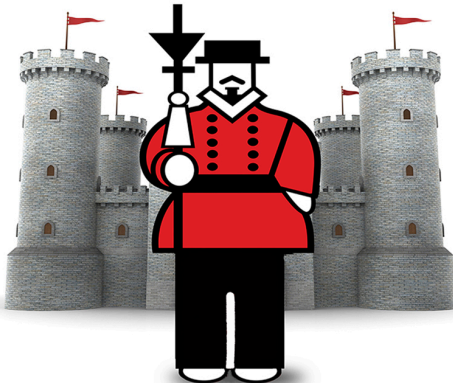

Electric Safety

Overhead Line Clearance
