Sheriff Chad Chronister is proud to announce the opening of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office Vocational Training Center. Over

the last year and a half, HCSO constructed a 10,000-square foot facility that will house four new programs offered to inmates.

"Since stepping into my role as Sheriff, I've always said, we cannot arrest our way out of crime," said Sheriff Chronister. "One of my first priorities as Sheriff was to create a holistic approach to reduce the rate of recidivism in our community."

Inmates will have the opportunity to learn trades like welding and carpentry. They can also learn how to operate a forklift and how to perform basic automotive services. The Vocational Training Center was built to prepare inmates for life after they finish their sentences.

"This vocational training program is part of a groundbreaking approach to reduce recidivism," said Sheriff Chronister. "Inmates, who complete the curriculum, will leave with a certificate in their chosen field. They'll also receive help on how to build a resume so that they can apply for jobs and interview with prospective employers. Most importantly, they will have the skills necessary to gain employment, so they don't have to return to the life they once lived."

Starting March 23, 2020, 24 inmates will begin preparing themselves for life after incarceration, learning valuable skills that will lead to better futures.

Classes will be taught by certified instructors through Hillsborough County Public Schools and Hillsborough technical colleges. HCSO case managers will facilitate classes on employability skills and money management. They'll also assist with job searches and registration on Employ Florida. Case managers will work closely with CareerSource Tampa Bay and the HCSO's Re-Entry Center to find employers who can provide job opportunities.

Information Required to Complete Hillsborough County Social Services Application

Hillsborough County Social Services determines eligibility by household. You must live within the boundaries of Hillsborough County. We will need the following documentation to apply:

- Two documents noting household physical address (no post office boxes) within Hillsborough County.
- Persons with a Social Security number please provide proof however all others may still apply. If you do not have a social security number, you may still apply.
- Florida identification card, Florida Driver's License, or other State or Country issued identification card or Passport accepted that is not expired.
- Proof of Identification required for minor children such as Birth Certificate, Shot Record, or Passport.
- Department of Children and Families benefit letter-indicating amount of benefits the family receives and the recipient names.
- Proof of all income received in the household for the last 30 days. Ex. Wages, SSI/SSD or Child Support.
