Year End Review

This past year, our club did indeed have a lot of fun. Thanks to a cooler spring, we extended our season and went on 23 Thursday rides and for the first time in years, 7 Saturday rides. Our club also had two trips, one in the fall to Williams, and a spring trip to Sierra Vista, Bisbee, and Tombstone. The weather was also helpful, in that we only had two canceled rides due to rain or wind. I am told that those riding home from Tombstone did experience the wind, and found that it can have an influence on gas mileage. On the Thursday and Saturday rides, we road for 4,411 miles. Last year was 3,008 miles, including 1 trip... Adding the two trips of 1,185 miles, we put a total of 5,596 miles on our bikes. If you are interested,



we averaged 13 bikes per ride, which is down from prior years. The average ride was 147 miles. Once again we found that the shorter and slower rides had the most bikes. A 94 mile ride had 22 bikes, and 24 people. One Saturday ride had 18 bikes, and 26 people, on a 136 mile trip.

Many of our club members are seasonal and have packed up and gone to their vacation homes. We wish you all well, and hope you have a safe and fun summer. I am sure many of you will continue to travel on your bikes, and of course we are interested in hearing (or seeing) about your journeys.


