Advancing the Salary Increase Date for Executive Director/Chief - UCEMS: Proposal: Immediately advance Anthony Buckner's salary to the promised \$74k, bypassing all waiting periods and step-ups outlined in his employment contract. On September 27, 2024, during the devastating floods, Anthony demonstrated exceptional leadership while evacuating patients and staff from the hospital rooftop. His calm and composed demeanor, paired with his knowledge and steady guidance, proved to be invaluable, providing both life-saving support and reassurance to those around him. In the weeks that have followed, Anthony has consistently worked alongside medics to ensure tasks are completed. His colleagues quickly learned they can rely on his expertise and trust his guidance. Thanks to his extensive knowledge and network, I firmly believe that his leadership has played a pivotal role in ensuring UCEMS is functioning at its highest level of efficiency. Anthony has embodied the qualities and traits that we hoped to see over the coming months. If there was ever a moment for the Board, the town of Erwin, the County, and others to recognize and show appreciation for Anthony's efforts, it is now. B. - Quick Brief re Donated Ambulances in addition to Unit from New Glarus Area EMS, we are receiving two additional ambulances: one from Broadway **Emergency Squad and the other from New Market** Volunteer Fire and Resue

With losing the hospital, we are going to see a spike in out-ofcounty transports. It's going to cause delays in getting crews to other calls. We are developing plans and ideas on how to minimize this going forward; however, this will be an issue that we want you to be aware of. Transport from Erwin to JCMC is 19 miles; Erwin to Sycamore Shoals (Elizabethton) is 20 miles. Wait times at the hospitals is also increasing day-byday.

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- D. Insurance Claim has been filed & full reimbursement has been received. Total amount filed/rec'vd for Durable Equipment = \$422,622.12; Total amount filed/rec'vd for Personal Belongings (on behalf of the employees on hospital rooftop) = \$3,061.00. NOTE: The Personal Belongings reimbursement checks were made payable to each individual and have been distributed to the appropriate employees. There was no deductible withheld from the reimbursement amount(s) due to no prior claims in the last three years
- E. Insurance Claim has been filed for Med #2, Med #3, Med #4 & Chief's Vehicle. Total amount field for Vehicles = \$441,800; There will be no deductible withheld from the reimbursement amount(s) due to no prior claims in the last three years. Reimbursement is still pending. Reimbursement monies should be placed into interest-bearing account when received.
- New built ambulance will cost us approx. \$276.000 and will have a lead time of 8-9 months (with UCEMS being put on a priority list). We have applied for a grant that will be awarded in December. We are hoping to be awarded grant money to use towards the purchase price of the new ambulance. In the meantime, we would like approval to purchase 1 ambulance, 3 power cots, 3 cardiac monitors and 3 ventilators. Board member Glenn White motioned to give Executive Director/Chief Anthony Buckner permission to purchase these outlined items. The motion was seconded by board member Roger Cooper.
