IDF heightens state of alert in anticipation of Iranian response

The IDF has not ruled out the possibility of an Iranian response from Syria, Yemen, or Iraq, rather than directly from Iran.

The IDF has heightened its state of alert and readiness in anticipation of a possible Iranian response to the recent Israeli strike, military sources said on Monday.

This increased vigilance includes daily situational assessments across all branches and divisions of the IDF General Staff, including the Home Front Command.

Intelligence gathering efforts have been intensified through various methods involving the entire intelligence community. At the same time, the Israeli air force remains on high alert, focusing on its

control and air defense systems.

"The presence of hundreds of American soldiers in Israel operating the THAAD missile defense system underscores the close cooperation between the IDF and US forces stationed here," a military official noted.

Deputy Chief of Staff Maj.-Gen. <u>Amir Baram</u> has also strengthened cooperative ties with his counterparts at US CENTCOM headquarters to prepare for various scenarios.

They further assessed that Iran is still considering its options for retaliation and evaluating the scale of their response. Not ruling out the possibility of an Iranian response

The **IDF has not ruled out the possibility** of an Iranian response from Syria, Yemen, or Iraq, rather than directly from Iran.

Additionally, security officials are not discounting the **possibility of Iranian attempts to target senior Israeli figures** both domestically

and abroad.

Security officials pointed out that Iran is likely weighing US warnings carefully while testing the limits, particularly during the American election period."An Iranian attack on Israel could impact the US elections, as Israel is deeply embedded in the political narratives of both Democratic and Republican campaigns," one source explained. Military sources confirmed that, despite assessments suggesting that the US elections might delay any Iranian response by at least a few days, the IDF has strategically reinforced its detection, warning, air defense, intelligence, and operational systems within the General Staff. https://www.jpost.com/israel-news/article-827568

IDF strikes Hezbollah's intelligence unit in Syria, issues rare confirmation

Attack said to kill 2 members of terror group, as 3 more commanders killed in Lebanon; 5 drones, some 60 rockets fired at north, most intercepted, while troops in Lebanon press on By Emanuel Fabian and Tol Staff 4 November 2024, 11:09 pm

In a rare acknowledgment, the IDF confirmed launching airstrikes in Syria on Monday, targeting what it said were infrastructure and assets of Hezbollah's intelligence division, as strikes on Hezbollah in Lebanon killed at least three of the terror group's commanders, according to the military.

Meanwhile, dozens of rockets were fired from Lebanon at the north, and the army said it shot down several drones, including two apparently launched from

Iraq.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, a Britain-based war monitor, said the strikes in Syria killed two Hezbollah members. According to the monitor, the strikes hit a house "used by members of Hezbollah and the Iranian Revolutionary Guard" south of Damascus, in Sayyidah Zaynab — home to an important Shiite sanctuary and guarded by pro-Iranian groups.

Syrian state media also reported the strikes, saying they targeted civilian sites, but caused only "material damage."

The IDF said its strikes "significantly" harmed Hezbollah's intelligence unit in Syria, which operates as an independent arm of the terror group's headquarters in Lebanon.

According to the army, the Syrian unit had already taken a hit when its commander, Mahmoud Muhammad Shahin, was killed in an October 4 airstrike in Beirut, along with Hussein Ali Hazima, head of Hezbollah's intelligence division.

That strike also killed top Hezbollah official Hashem Safieddine, the heir-apparent to the terror group's longtime leader Hassan Nasrallah, whom Israel killed in late September.

Shahin was a veteran member of Hezbollah, especially in the terror group's intelligence division, and had headed the division's Syria branch since 2007, the military said.

According to the IDF, Shahin maintained contact with the Syrian regime and Iranian officials, and as part of his role "he led the development and deployment of intelligence and air defense capabilities in coordination with various parts of the Iranian axis."

Israel has been carrying out airstrikes inside Syria since the civil war there began in 2011, mainly targeting attempts to transfer weapons to the Iran-backed Hezbollah or to keep Iranian fighters themselves from gaining a foothold near Israel's border.

Since Hamas's brutal October 7, 2023, massacre, which saw some 1,200 people killed in southern Israel and 251 kidnapped, Israel has escalated its strikes on Iranian-backed terror targets in Syria and has also struck

Two barrages of some 30 rockets each were fired from Lebanon at the Galilee on Monday. According to the IDF, some of the rockets launched in the attacks were intercepted and the rest hit open areas. The military said it struck a Hezbollah launcher used to fire the first of the two barrages.

The IDF also said Monday that it downed five

drones, including two in the morning that had crossed into Israeli airspace "from the east" — usually code for aircraft launched from Iraq. The military later published footage of some of the interceptions.

In Lebanon, combat engineers with the 188th Armored Brigade, operating in forested areas near the border, discovered and demolished a Hezbollah tunnel slated for a planned invasion of Israel, the IDF said, publishing footage of the tunnel.

The troops also located weapon bunkers hidden in the forested areas, the IDF added.

Meanwhile, forces from the 91st Division continued to destroy terror infrastructure and confront gunmen in southern Lebanon, the military said.

It said that forces from the 228th Brigade spotted a gunman in a building near the border with Israel, and opened fire at the building.

Three Hezbollah commanders, including a member of the terror group's elite Radwan Force, were also killed in separate airstrikes on southern Lebanon, the IDF said.

Israeli Air Force jets struck and killed Abu Ali Rida, the Hezbollah commander of the Baraachit

area, the IDF said, adding that he was responsible for planning and carrying out rocket and anti-tank missile attacks on Israeli troops, and had commanded terror activities by Hezbollah operatives in that area.

Another strike in as-Sultaniyah killed Riyad Reda Ghazzawi, whom the IDF identified as a commander in the Radwan Force's anti-tank missile unit. The IDF said he was behind numerous anti-tank attacks on Israel and troops operating in southern Lebanon.



Additional strikes targeted several buildings in Safad al-Battikh, where the IDF said Hezbollah members were operating. A commander at Hezbollah's headquarters was killed in the strikes, the IDF said, adding that he had been responsible for recruitment and transferring weapons to Hezbollah cells.

Israel invaded Lebanon in late September, days after stepping up its attacks on Hezbollah in a bid to make the north safe for some 60,000 displaced residents to go home.

The residents were evacuated soon after the Hamas

massacre, out of fear Hezbollah would carry out a similar assault in the north. A day after the massacre, Hezbollahled forces began attacking the north on a near-daily basis.

The attacks on northern Israel since October 2023 have resulted in the deaths of 40 civilians. In addition, 61 IDF soldiers and reservists have died in cross-border skirmishes and in the ground operation launched in southern Lebanon in late September. Two soldiers were killed in a drone attack from Iraq, and there have been several attacks from Syria, as well, without any injuries.

The Lebanese health ministry announced on Monday that the country's death toll in the Israel-Hezbollah war had crossed 3,000. The figure does not distinguish between civilians and combatants. https://www.timesofisrael.com/idf-strikes-hezbollahs-intelligence-unit-in-syria-issues-rare-confirmation/

'Carved in stone': IDF troops unearth a 70-meter-long underground space in southern Lebanon

IDF troops unearthed a 70-meter-long underground infrastructure belonging to Hezbollah in southern Lebanon the military said on Tuesday.

Within the subterranean space, soldiers found a room and weapons for a lengthy stay.

"We entered a military camp in a thicketed and fortified terrain in the center of a wadi," a Battalion chief of the 646th Brigade said.



He added that the company had found "deep inside in the terrain, a very, very deep underground infrastructure with ammunition, basically, an ammunition storage facility that was concealed in the thicketed terrain."

They essentially created a bunker inside the terrain, carved inside a stone."

An additional raid unearthed another underground terror infrastructure that had room for prolonged stay and supplies.

The IDF added that after unearthing the infrastructure, they were destroyed, and the weapons

were confiscated.

Troops demolished dozens of Hezbollah military structures and eliminated terrorists via aircraft

fire.

Operations based on intelligence information

The military noted that troops had carried out targeted operations in various southern Lebanese villages based on precise intelligence information.

Over 60 PFLP operatives arrested in West Bank and Lebanon — IDF, Shin Bet

Authorities say key figures in terror group among those nabbed; PA says 2 dead in airstrike in Jenin area, plus 5 others killed in clashes with troops in northern West Bank

Over 60 operatives from the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine terror group organization have been arrested in counterterror operations in the West Bank and Lebanon, the IDF and Shin Bet announced in a joint statement on Tuesday.

Among those arrested in the West Bank was the head of the Women's Committees Association of the PFLP, Abla Sa'adat, the wife of PFLP head Ahmad Sa'adat who

has been jailed in Israel since 2006. In addition, Tahrir Badran Gaber, an activist from Ramallah was also detained, officials said.

The Women's Committees Association of the PFLP has been declared to be a terror organization by Israel.

The IDF and Shin Bet said key figures who served as the heads of the PFLP in the West Bank

were among those arrested, in addition to terrorists who operated in the field for the organization. The statement added that students at West Bank universities who were active members of PFLP cells at the educational institutions were also detained.

Offices and businesses were raided and closed down by troops, including a printing press that



produced inflammatory materials for the PFLP.

The statement also said that the military has been acting against the terror group in Lebanon since the killing of the PFLP commander at the end of September. According to the military and Shin Bet, Nidal Abd al-Aal was involved in planning and advancing terror attacks in the West Bank.

IDF announces West Bank airstrike; PA says two dead Meanwhile, at least seven people were killed during an Israel Defense Forces raid and airstrikes

in the West Bank on Tuesday, according to the Palestinian Authority health ministry, as the military targeted an armed terror cell in the Qabatiya area near Jenin.

The PA ministry and Palestinian media reports said two people were killed in an airstrike on a vehicle in Qabatiya, while three were shot dead by troops there and two others were killed in a standoff with troops in the nearby Tammun area, north of Nablus.

The Maan news agency claimed that an earlier drone attack in Tammun involved more than one missile and caused no injuries.

An initial IDF statement announcing the airstrike in the Qabatiya area did not give further details.

The strike came amid a military operation in Qabatiya that also reportedly saw a gun battle between troops and local operatives.

The <u>#IDF</u> conducted a targeted strike on a terrorist cell in Qabatiya, a town in the <u>#Jenin</u> Governorate of the West Bank. Reports indicate at least two eliminations.

Meanwhile, Border Police at a West Bank checkpoint in the Gush Etzion bloc stopped a wanted suspect carrying one million shekels in cash, Hebrew media outlets reported.

Since October 7, troops have arrested some 5,250 wanted Palestinians across the West Bank, including more than 2,050 affiliated with Hamas.

According to the Palestinian Authority's health ministry, more than 716 West Bank Palestinians have been killed in that time. The IDF says the vast majority of them were gunmen killed in exchanges of fire, rioters who clashed with troops, or terrorists carrying out attacks.

During the same period, 41 people, including Israeli security personnel, have been killed in terror attacks in Israel and the West Bank. Another six members of the security forces were killed in clashes with terror operatives in the West Bank.

Israel offers \$5 million and safe passage for release of Hamas hostages, sources say Netanyahu meets with hostage families and sets price for each released captive, offering safe passage for captors to third country as part of deal; sources say communication with mediators ongoing, hoping to reach deal while Biden still in office

Israel has offered \$5 million for the release of each hostage held by Hamas, along with safe passage for the captors to a third country, in a bid to secure their freedom, sources familiar with the matter said Tuesday.

Officials are working to publicize the offer through various channels, hoping to incentivize those holding the hostages.

Israeli officials also believe that a "renewed momentum" for advancing a deal could emerge after the U.S. elections. The sources said that communication with mediators is ongoing, primarily to explore whether Hamas can be persuaded to soften its demands, which currently include ending the war and a full Israeli withdrawal from Gaza.

Several options are reportedly on the table, including a

limited initial deal (similar to Egypt's proposal), a phased agreement or a single comprehensive deal. However, all options face significant challenges.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu held an extended assessment on the hostage situation Sunday night, with more talks expected in the coming days. Netanyahu also met with families of the hostages Monday evening.

Officials anticipate that the U.S. election results will greatly impact negotiations, with President Joe Biden reportedly determined to finalize a deal before his term ends in January. The election outcome could influence mediators—Egypt and Qatar—as well as Hamas, as all parties seek to demonstrate their willingness to reach an agreement and end the war.

'There will be no deal right now'

A senior member of the negotiating team for the hostage deal updated families this week, saying that Israel and Hamas have been unable to reach any agreement or compromise on ending the war in Gaza. "There is someone to talk to, but nothing to talk about," the official said, describing the current state of negotiations. "There is a clear understanding within the defense establishment that the hostages will not be returned unless the war in Gaza ends, and right now, there is no willingness from the government to end the war."

Reports Monday from Jerusalem indicated significant pessimism regarding the negotiations. Hamas informed mediators that it refuses to agree to any deal short of a complete cessation of the war and a full Israeli withdrawal from Gaza. The terror group has effectively rejected proposals for smaller, more limited deals.

right now. Not a small one, not a big one, not even a partial one,"

sources familiar with the matter said. "The real question is whether the time has come to save the remaining hostages and end the war in Gaza. That is the entire discussion, and this is what's happening behind the scenes. There will be no deal without a decision to end the war in Gaza. We must face the facts."

Despite this, the prevailing understanding in Jerusalem is that if Prime Minister Netanyahu opts for a deal tied to ending the war, his government would likely collapse, making such a scenario highly unlikely. There is speculation that Netanyahu may seek to link a major deal to normalization with Saudi Arabia, but that could take many months to materialize. In the meantime, the hostages, who are in constant danger, may not survive long enough for such an agreement to be reached.

As the parties await the outcome of the U.S. elections—and its impact on the negotiations former hostage survivor Maya Sham called on the next U.S. president, whether Kamala Harris or Donald Trump, to do everything in their power to secure the hostages' release. "I came here to cry out to the world and to the world's greatest superpower, to demand that whoever is elected in the United States must do everything to release the hostages—not some, not a few. These are our brothers and sisters, suffering every day, every hour, with no one answering their cries," Sham said at the "Shurat HaDin" Conference on Combatting Antisemitism.

The Hope Forum, representing some of the hostage families, welcomed the setting of a financial offer for the release of the hostages. "The value of the hostages' lives outweighs the importance of strict justice, especially when it protects the lives of other Israeli citizens. We support this initiative and want to see all of our children brought home," the forum said. <u>https://www.ynetnews.com/article/h1fiftvw1g</u>

Terror tunnel with no exit point discovered in the Jordan Valley

Clashes with terrorists, aerial strikes, and weapons discovery: Israeli security forces conduct three parallel brigade-wide operations.

Forces from the IDF, ISA, Border Police, and the Prison Service's Masada Unit on Monday night began brigade-wide operations in the Jordan Valley, valley region, Menashe, and Samaria.

During the operation, the forces arrived by helicopter and vehicle, and surrounded the Tamon and Paroh areas. During the operation, the forces exchanged fire with the terrorists and located seven explosive devices in a mosque. IAF aircraft struck and eliminated two armed terrorists, and located their weapons. An additional terrorist was eliminated in a later clash.

During the operation in the Menashe Brigade region, an armed terror cell was hit in an aerial strike, after the terrorists fired at the forces and hurled explosives at them. In addition, an explosives lab was found, and a number of wanted suspects were arrested.

In the Samaria Brigade region, the forces began an operation in the Madama and Burin areas, and in the Etzion area, four weapons were confiscated, terror funds were seized, and nine suspects were arrested. In Tapuah in Judea, and Qalqiliya in Ephraim, homemade explosive devices were found and destroyed, and five additional weapons were found as well.

In addition, during operations by the Jordan Valley Brigade, underground terror infrastructure was found, which did not have an exit opening. <u>http://www.israelnationalnews.com/news/398653</u>

IDF to issue 7,000 more draft orders to Haredim after unsuccessful first phase

Military sent out 3,000 orders over the summer, but only 230 ultra-Orthodox men showed up at induction centers; Halevi briefed on status of new Haredi brigade

The Israel Defense Forces will send out another 7,000 draft orders to members of the ultra-Orthodox community next week after the first phase of a plan to draft Haredi soldiers was largely unsuccessful.

Defense Minister Yoav Gallant met with IDF Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Herzi Halevi and other military officials including Deputy Chief of Staff Maj. Gen. Amir Baram; the chief of the Personnel Directorate, Maj. Gen. Yaniv Asor;

and the Military Advocate General, Maj. Gen. Yifat Tomer-Yerushalmi — and was presented with the summary of the first phase of the Haredi draft plan, his office said.

The IDF had sent out 3,000 draft orders in that stage, over the summer, although just 230 showed up at induction centers.

At the end of the meeting on Monday, Gallant approved the IDF's recommendation to send out 7,000 more draft orders to ultra-Orthodox men.



The IDF has said it will act in accordance with the law, and that those who ignore multiple draft orders will be prevented from leaving the country and may face arrest by Military Police and be taken to military jails.

Still, there have been no reports of such arrests being carried out so far.

The orders, which constitute the first stage in the screening and evaluation process that the army carries out for recruits ahead of enlistment in the military in the coming year, come after a landmark High Court ruling in June that said there was no longer any legal framework allowing the state to

refrain from drafting Haredi yeshiva students into military service. The attorney general then ordered the government to immediately begin the process of conscription for



3,000 such men.

The military has said that it currently requires some 10,000 new soldiers — mostly combat troops — but can only accommodate the enlistment of an additional 3,000 ultra-Orthodox this year, due to their special needs. This group is in addition to some 1,800 Haredi soldiers who are already drafted annually. *IDF Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Herzi Halevi meets with Sgt. The IDF aims to open new units for Haredi troops, in addition to the existing ones that include the Netzah Yehuda Battalion in the Kfir Brigade, the Tomer Company in the Givati Brigade's Rotem Battalion, the Hetz Company in the Paratroopers Brigade's 202nd Battalion, and the Nevatim Airbase's ground defense unit, as well as numerous other non-combat roles.

In a separate meeting on Monday, Halevi was presented with the status of an in-development brigade for ultra-Orthodox Jews, known as the Hasmonean Brigade.

According to the IDF, so far the military has completed drafting the staff for the first Haredi brigade, as well as establishing infrastructure for the induction of the brigade's first company next month.



Senior officers, including the chief of the Ground Forces, Maj. Gen. Tamir Yadai, presented Halevi with the status of the ongoing work, the military said.

The dispute over the ultra-Orthodox community serving in the military is one of the most contentious in Israel, with decades of governmental and judicial attempts to settle the issue never achieving a stable resolution. The Haredi religious and political leadership fiercely resists any effort to draft young men.

Many ultra-Orthodox Jews believe that military service is incompatible with

their way of life, and fear that those who enlist will be secularized.

Israelis who do serve, however, say the decades-long arrangement of mass exemptions unfairly burdens them, a sentiment that has intensified since the October 7 onslaught and the ensuing war, in which more than 780 soldiers have been killed and some 300,000 citizens called up to reserve duty.

This past year, 63,000 Haredi males were listed as eligible for military service.

Government loses majority for vote on daycare subsidies for Haredi draft evaders

9 coalition lawmakers, including Likud MKs, say they'll vote against bill seen by critics as effort to circumvent ultra-Orthodox IDF draft; PM lobbying MKs in bid to boost support

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's ruling coalition has lost the votes required to pass the so-called Daycare Law being pushed by the ultra-Orthodox United Torah Judaism party, with several lawmakers indicating that they cannot support the controversial legislation.

On Monday evening, Likud MK Yuli Edelstein, the chairman of the powerful Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee, declared that he will not support the bill, stating that during a time of war, Israel's leaders are "obligated to make every effort to provide the IDF with additional soldiers."

As such, "I will not lend my hand to the Daycare Law, nor to any law that attempts to circumvent our ceaseless efforts to expand the conscription base in the State of Israel," Edelstein said in a video statement sent to the press.

His statement came on the heels of similar expressions of opposition by fellow Likud MKs Moshe Saada and Dan Illouz.

In a tweet last week, Illouz argued that it will be impossible to recruit significant numbers of Haredim into the IDF "without significant personal sanctions" and that "exempting such a large group from the duty to serve in the IDF in such a critical period is a non-Zionist act that is unworthy of us as a nation."

Immigration Minister Ofir Sofer, a Religious Zionism MK, has also come out against the bill, telling Army Radio that the measure "won't be advanced before there is progress on the enlistment law."

In addition, Minister Gideon Sa'ar, the chairman of the coalition's New Hope party, said on Sunday that his party's four lawmakers would also vote against the legislation when it comes up for a Knesset vote.

"The enactment of the law during the current state of affairs will convey a message of encouraging evasion from service in the IDF and will assist in doing so," he tweeted, calling on the government to "strive to carry out

significant moves that increase the participation of all sections of the public" in military service.

Deputy Minister Avi Maoz, of the far-right Noam party, said Tuesday that he also intended to vote against the legislation in the Knesset, noting his efforts to "correct the injustice and discrimination" against reservists from the national-religious community, who have been heavily called upon to serve and have suffered relatively heavy casualties.

In total, nine lawmakers have indicated that they will oppose the bill. The coalition holds an eight-seat majority, and Defense Minister Yoav Gallant is also widely expected to vote against the law. The government advanced the proposed law on Sunday in the Ministerial Committee for Legislation. The bill is slated to soon head to the Knesset for a vote in a preliminary reading.

The legislation, which was submitted last week, aims to guarantee that the children of ultra-Orthodox men who are obligated to perform military service, but have not done so, will continue to be eligible for state-paid daycare subsidies. It aims to circumvent a High Court of Justice <u>ruling that such</u> financial support is illegal in cases where the father should be serving in the Israel Defense Forces but is not.

UTJ demanded the bill's swift passage after backing down from a threat to derail government budget talks unless the coalition immediately passed a law enshrining the widespread exemption of Haredi yeshiva students from military service.

The bill is highly controversial, with critics asserting that it would continue to encourage ultra-Orthodox men not to perform military service even as the IDF faces severe manpower shortages after a yearlong multifront war against the Hamas and Hezbollah terror groups.

It has **been called "unconstitutional" by the Attorney General's Office**, which has argued that "the principle of equality will be harmed through state and institutional encouragement of avoiding conscription into the IDF."

Netanyahu, fearing a break with UTJ on the matter, is reportedly working to pressure lawmakers from both the coalition and opposition to vote for the legislation.

According to Hebrew media reports, the coalition has indicated that it would postpone the vote if it cannot secure enough support, leading UTJ to threaten to boycott upcoming votes on other coalition-backed legislation.

Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich's Religious Zionism party is still on the fence regarding the bill, <u>conditioning its support</u> on the addition of language enshrining preferential treatment for the families of IDF reservists.

Religious Zionism MKs Moshe Solomon and Ohad Tal both denied opposing the bill on Tuesday afternoon, only hours after reports indicated that the pair planned to vote against it.

In a joint statement, the two lawmakers stated that there had been "negotiations throughout the morning between [UTJ] MK Yisrael Eichler and Religious Zionism." Knesset approves bill banning teachers who support terrorism, cutting funds to schools

'Terror supporters can no longer be teachers in Israel - it is regrettable that this took us nearly two years, but better late than never,' says bill sponsor MK Amit Halevi

The Knesset on Tuesday approved a bill that would ban the employment of educators and cut funding to schools that express support for acts of terrorism or terrorist organizations.

The bill, proposed by MKs Zvika Fogel (Otzma Yehudit) and Amit Halevi (Likud), passed with 55 votes in favor and 45 against. "Terror supporters can no longer be teachers in Israel," Halevi said. Under the legislation, the director-general of the Education Ministry will have the authority to

summarily dismiss a public school teacher without prior notice if the teacher has been convicted of a serious security offense, terrorism-related crime or has publicly expressed support for an act of terror or called for one to take place. The director-general can also refuse to approve the hiring of such educators, with the decision subject to a hearing process. That should have been the case long ago. – rdb]

Additionally, the **bill grants the education minister the power to reduce or revoke state funding for schools found to have expressed or supported acts of terror or terrorist organizations**, if the school administration should have been aware of such activities. This decision would also be subject to a hearing.

Presenting the bill to the Knesset, Education Committee Chairman MK Yosef Taieb (Shas) said, "The purpose of this legislation is to eradicate support for and identification with terrorism within



educational institutions in the Jewish state. The influence of such sentiments on students is deeply troubling. This bill is essential and has been carefully deliberated. We cannot allow teachers in Israel who support or align with acts of terrorism."

The bill's sponsors MKs Amit Halevi and Zvika Fogel (Photo: Knesset, Wikipedia) MK Fogel, who chairs the Knesset's National Security Committee, added: "Teachers are among the most influential figures on children and youth in Israeli schools. This bill aims to

ensure that educators do not exploit their influence to encourage students to engage in terrorist activity and that schools do not condone such actions."

MK Halevi emphasized, "Today, the Knesset is taking a crucial step in the fight against our enemies by targeting the strongest foundation of terrorism—education. Terror supporters can no longer serve as teachers in Israel, and schools that align with terrorism will have their funding revoked by the education minister. The law ensures that Israeli students will be educated in justice, science and compassion—not in terrorism, injustice and barbarism. Netanyahu laments 'witch hunt' as police probe incidents from start of war

Unit 433 carried out a criminal investigation on incidents which occurred at the start of the Israel-Hamas War, police said.

The Magistrate's Court in Rishon Lezion allowed limited information to be released about an ongoing criminal investigation, initiated by Lahav 433, into events at the start of the Israel-Hamas War, Israel Police announced on Tuesday.

The Israel Police stated, "The Israel Police, Unit 433, is conducting a criminal investigation related to events from the beginning of the war, during which several investigative actions were conducted openly. A gag order has been issued on

the case."

The Prime Minister's Office said in response, "This is an unprecedented witch hunt against the Prime Minister's Office in the middle of a war."

"After a year of a flood of criminal leaks from cabinet discussions and meetings about hostages and missing persons—which provided valuable intelligence to our enemies—the only two investigations that were opened targeted the Prime Minister's Office rather than the wholesale **leakers**, none of whom were investigated, and who caused tremendous harm to the hostages and to Israel's security," the statement further stated.

"As with previous attempts to inflate accusations against the prime minister and his circle, this too will amount to nothing," the PMO noted, adding, "But it will certainly raise serious questions about unprecedented and baseless selective enforcement."

On Sunday, Judge Menachem Mizrahi, President of the Magistrate's Court in Rishon Lezion, permitted the release of information identifying Eliezer Feldstein as the primary suspect in a case involving leaks and the theft of a classified IDF document. His detention was extended until Tuesday, along with the detention of two additional suspects connected to the defense establishment. A fourth suspect was released to house arrest.

Judge Mizrahi has determined that the investigation, conducted by the Shin Bet, Lahav 433's National Serious and International Crime Unit, the Israel Police, and the IDF, is being handled with the highest level of professionalism. Consequently, he decided to withhold further details to avoid jeopardizing the investigation.

After the publication of the investigation was released, the <u>October 7</u> Civilian Commission of Inquiry released a statement, saying, "Enough is enough. It is intolerable that while a state inquiry committee has yet to be established, efforts are underway to sabotage its future operations."

"Tonight's serious revelations reinforce what we've been calling for over a year: any delay in forming a state inquiry committee risks allowing those involved to cover up responsibility and avoid accountability," the statement ended.

NY Jewish man requires 18 stitches after being slashed in face in 'vicious' antisemitic hate crime

A Jewish man suffered a near-fatal antisemitic attack in Brooklyn in an incident that the NYPD is investigating as a hate crime.

As *The Jerusalem Post* reported at the time, a visibly Jewish man, named as Sadya Liberow, was <u>slashed in the face</u> while walking on the intersection between Flatbush and Lafayette avenues.

Liberow, a father of two daughters under three, was approached by a man in a mask who shouted "F*** you guys," which Liberow said was an obvious reference to Jews. The attacker proceeded to slash Liberow's face with a blade before walking away from the scene.

After the attacker left, Liberow called 911 and the emergency medical service Hatzalah and then removed his shirt to tie around his face to stem the bleeding, his mother, Nechama, told the



Post.Liberow called the attack a "vicious act of hate," which was one more in a "troubling <u>rise of Jew-hate crimes</u> in our city, state, and country.

"I trust that the NYPD Hate Crime Unit will take this case with the seriousness it deserves and [will] hopefully apprehend the anti-Jewish, masked individual before other Jews are targeted and attacked," he added.

Liberow required 18 internal and external stitches and two hours of facial plastic surgery to seal up the wound, which stretches from the corner of his mouth to his ear, Nechama said. She added that her son now finds it difficult to speak and sleep and could not eat solid food for several days.

"I was walking down the street to go to the Apple store, and instead, I get slashed in the face," Liberow told NBC New York. "I felt the blood gushing down my face."Liberow's mother, Nechama, said, "He approached my son, saying, "F*** you guys. 'Guys' is us. 'Guys' is the Jewish community. I cannot stand quiet while so many Jews are being attacked."

Attacker yet to be identified

In her conversation with the Post, Nechama thanked the NYPD Hate Crime Unit for its assistance in finding the attacker but noted the challenges the investigative team faces as the attacker was fully masked, wearing a puffy coat, and almost fully covered beside his eyes. He has yet to be identified.

According to the NYPD, there have been 312 incidents of antisemitic hate crimes so far in 2024, as opposed to the 230 recorded in 2023. The Jew Hate Database urged authorities to take swift and decisive action and also called on law enforcement and local leaders to condemn acts of hate. Canadian University hires terrorist convicted of killing 4 in Paris synagogue bombing

A Lebanese terrorist who was convicted in France for a synagogue bombing that killed four people is teaching a sociology course at a Canadian university in Ottawa

Dr. Hassan Diab, whose course at Carleton University is called "Social

Justice in Action," was unanimously convicted in France and sentenced to life in prison for a bombing at the Rue Copernic Reform synagogue, which killed four and injured 46.

After his arrest in 2008, Diab fled to Canada, and although he was extradited to France in 2014, he spent only two years in prison before being placed on house arrest and escaping once again.

A son of one of the victims of the bombing, TV presenter Aliza Shragir, said the decision to allow Diab to teach was "outrageous."

Idit Shamir, the Israeli consul general in Toronto, posted on X that the decision was "unconscionable." She wrote, "Hassan Diab, the terrorist who murdered my friend's mother, Aliza Shagrir, before his eyes in the 1980 Paris synagogue bombing, still lectures at Canada's @Carleton_U."

"A French court gave him life for murdering 4 souls & maiming 46. Yet Carleton University rewards him with a teaching position?"

"This isn't just a failure of justice," Shamir added. "It's spitting on the graves of Jewish victims."

B'nai Brith of Canada expressed dismay at Carleton University's decision to ignore its plea not to hire the convicted terrorist as part of the institution's faculty.

"Despite being handed a life sentence by a French court, Hassan Diab continues to live freely in Canada, while Carleton University, unconscionably, continues to allow him the privilege of teaching at a Canadian Institution," B'nai Brith said in a statement.

The university heeded B'nai Brith's warning in 2009 and said that Diab had been replaced "in the interest of providing students with a stable, productive academic environment that is conducive to learning." Jewish man kicked out of cafe over Star of David hat

The cafe is already under scrutiny for controversial drink names allegedly referencing Hamas.

A Jewish man was kicked out of a cafe in Oakland, California, for wearing a hat with a Star of David on it last week.

In a now-viral video uploaded October 26, Jonathan Hirsch was confronted by the owner of Jerusalem Coffee House, Abdulrahim Harara, arguing that the star on his hat possessed a "violent" connotation, identifying him as a "Zionist."

Harara and Hirsch had a heated argument, and Hirsch

accused the cafe of discrimination.

"You're being asked to leave. You're causing a disruption. This is a private business. You're being asked to leave," Harara said.

"This gentleman asked me to leave because of my hat," Hirsch said from behind the camera.

Harara told Hirsch that his hat was violent, asking, "Are you a Zionist?"

"I don't have to identify myself," Hirsch answered, accusing the owner of discrimination and threatening to sue the cafe.

"I wear this hat all the time," Hirsch told Fox outlet KTVU, "I mean, I've had this hat for years. And it means a lot to me. It's meant a lot more over the last year."

Hirsch explained to KTVU that he had only gone into the cafe because his 5-year-old son needed to use the bathroom.

"I wasn't going out looking for a fight. But when someone comes up to me fighting, I can't teach my son [that] Jews are these meek people that run and cower," He said.

Videos showed Oakland Police officers attempting to de-escalate the situation, ultimately asking Hirsch to leave the cafe as anti-Israel protesters began arriving.

The Jerusalem Coffee House

The Jerusalem Coffee House recently made waves on social media for their drinks, seemingly supporting Hamas. The drinks were named "Iced In Tea Fada" and "Sweet <u>Sinwar</u>."

However, Harara denied that the drink was named after the terrorist leader.

Jeremy Russell, spokesman for the Jewish Community Relations Council Bay Area, told KTVU that Saturday's incident was "one of the most clear-cut cases of <u>anti-Jewish discrimination</u> that I have seen." <u>https://www.jpost.com/diaspora/article-827589</u>

Ukrainian drone hits residential building in Belgorod – governor

A Ukrainian drone injured at least one person when it struck an apartment building in Russia's Belgorod Region on Tuesday, causing a fire, local governor Vyacheslav Gladkov has said.

A man whose leg was hurt by shrapnel in the incident was subsequently taken to a city hospital, the official said. Firefighters are tackling the blaze, which has spread across three apartments in the building, he added. Gladkov characterized the

incident as a Ukrainian military attack against a civilian target.

Unconfirmed media reports previously said multiple people were injured in the incident. Gladkov said the damage was being clarified.

Belgorod is the capital of a region of the same name on the Ukrainian border. It has suffered from regular attacks launched by Kiev's forces amid the wider conflict between the two nations.

In May, Russia launched an incursion into neighboring Kharkov Region, which it said was meant to make it harder for Ukraine to attack nearby Belgorod Region with shorter-range weapons, such as artillery guns and small drones. Kiev has long-range kamikaze drones in its arsenal, which it uses to strike targets deep inside Russia.

BRICS Summit proves West cannot isolate Russia – Lavrov

The gathering in Kazan last month was one of the most significant recent international events, Sergey Lavrov has said

BRICS Summit in Kazan, Russia, October 2024 © Sputnik / Aleksey Danichev The recent BRICS Summit in Kazan showed the futility of Western attempts to isolate Russia, and proved that many countries are unhappy with the US waging "sanctions wars," Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov has said.

Delegations from 35 countries of Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe and Latin America, as well as representatives from the UN and other organizations, arrived in Russia last month for the annual BRICS Summit. It

was the first to be held since the group's expansion earlier this year, when Egypt, Iran, Ethiopia, and the United Arab Emirates officially became members, joining Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa.

"The 16th BRICS Summit in Kazan was, without exaggeration, one of the most significant international events not only this year, but in recent times," Lavrov said on Tuesday in an interview with Rossiya Segodnya news agency.

According to the foreign minister, participants felt it was held in an atmosphere of *"friendship, openness and mutual respect."* Asked about summit results and the group's plans, Lavrov said they were clearly reflected in the Kazan Declaration, adopted at the gathering.

"Among other things, it clearly sets out the commitment of the participating countries to promote positive changes in the global economy and politics with the aim of creating a more just and balanced world order, reform global governance institutions and effectively address global issues," he said.

Lavrov also highlighted parts of the declaration relating to adapting the global financial system to "modern realities," while increasing the role of developing countries and encouraging closer interbank cooperation.

This involves boosting the share of national currencies in mutual settlements and creating independent payment platforms and insurance mechanisms in BRICS, he said.

All of these steps will ultimately lead to the formation of a payment instrument that is *"not subject to external risks,"* Lavrov predicted, noting *"increased interest"* in such a plan from non-Western states.

The Russian minister added that during the extended Outreach/BRICS Plus format session, the heads of delegations from countries of the Global South "openly expressed indignation at the US authorities' increasingly strong line in recent years on using the dollar as an instrument for waging sanction wars against those states whose policies, for one reason or another, the Americans did not like."

Asked about BRICS' new 'partner country' status, Lavrov said that the criteria were approved in Kazan, and work is underway on the issue, with results expected before the end of the year. <u>https://www.rt.com/news/607033-brics-west-russia-lavrov/</u>

Russian forces pummel hangar where Ukrainian troops were hiding (VIDEO)

A group of soldiers was repeatedly hit by strikes in Donbass town of Krasonogorovka, according to a clip

Russian forces have blown up a building with a Ukrainian infantry squad inside, RT Russian has reported, releasing video of a relentless drone hunt in a Donbass town.

An undated five-minute clip shared by RT war correspondent Andrey Filatov on Tuesday shows intense battlefield action in

Krasonogorovka, about eleven miles (18km) west of Donetsk and nine miles east of the key Ukrainiancontrolled logistics hub of Kurakhovo.

The footage, filmed from a reconnaissance drone, begins with operators spotting three Ukrainian military vehicles approaching the town at high speed. The Russian drone operators, who had the opportunity to observe the entire process of the redeployment from above, later become excited when they see a vehicle – a US-made Hummer or Humvee – carrying at least six Ukrainian soldiers.

As one of the vehicles comes to a halt next to a dilapidated building, several consecutive explosions go off a few meters away from the soldiers as the troops are apparently hit by Russian artillery. While the first explosion appears to have caused no casualties, it is unclear if the same was true for the others. Meanwhile, a Russian UAV continued to buzz the entrance to the building, dropping a bomb on a trajectory that allowed it to fly directly into the hangar where at least some of the soldiers were taking shelter.

The clip later shows an armed Ukrainian soldier in a flak jacket walking inside the building, which is then rocked by another explosion, sending clouds of smoke through the skeleton roof. Despite poor visibility, a Russian drone operator is heard shouting that the strike had hit the infantryman.

Krasonogorovka lies on the approaches to Kurakhovo, a town on a key road leading to the regional logistical hub at Pokrovsk, which is essential for supplying all Ukrainian forces in Donbass. The Kurakhovo area has been the scene of fierce fighting between Russian and Ukrainian forces since October, after Moscow made significant gains in the region in recent months.

Democrats unveil dark, diabolical plans to prevent Trump from retaking White House – even if he wins!

With results from the 2024 presidential election now imminent, Democrats have been vocal in their plans to subvert the will of the American people and prevent former President Donald Trump from retaking the White House if he pulls out a win over his Democratic rival Vice President Kamala Harris.

In a February opinion piece by Russel Berman, published by the Atlantic, it details how the Democrats could could try to disqualify Trump if the U.S. Supreme Court didn't declare Trump ineligible to run for president.

The 14th Amendment of the United States Constitution bars anyone who has "engaged in insurrection" against the U.S. Those found guilty of such an act are unable to run for civil, military, or elected office without first gaining the approval of at least two-thirds of the House and Senate.

Berman states that during the end of the Supreme Court arguments concerning Trump's exclusion from the Colorado ballot as an insurrectionist, attorney Jason Murray – who represented Colorado voters – told the justices they would have another J6 situation on their hands if they refused to disqualify Trump. Murray told Berman the decision would "come back with a vengeance," when Congress meets to count and certify the Electoral College votes.

According to Murray, a Trump win would cause a "constitutional crisis in Congress," where Democrats would have to choose whether they confirm someone they "believe is ineligible," or defy the will of the people.

"Democrats have a serious chance of winning a majority in Congress in November, even if Trump recaptures the presidency on the same day. If that happens, they could have the votes to prevent him from taking office," Berman wrote.

However, despite House Democrats and a handful of Republicans attempting to impeach Trump in 2021 for "inciting insurrection," Trump has never been convicted of insurrection in a court of law, nor has he ever been indicted on an insurrection charge.

U.S. Rep. Jamie Raskin, D-Md., said the Supreme Court is refusing to do its job by pretending Section 3 of the 14th Amendment "doesn't exist," and the justices' refusal to interpret the meaning of the amendment will lead to civil war.

"A great example going on right now before our very eyes is Section 3 of the 14th Amendment that they're just disappearing with a magic wand as if it doesn't exist," Raskin said, adding, "So, you know they want to kick it to Congress, so it's going to be up to us on January 6th, 2025, to tell the rampaging Trump mobs that he's disqualified. Then we need

During an interview with Bill Maher, Raskin said the Democrats are not going to "allow" the Republicans to "steal" the election, and despite his comments about not certifying Electoral College votes – Raskin said Democrats would honor the results.

"So when I say 'we will support a free and fair election,' no we're not gonna allow them to steal it in the states, or steal it in the Department of Justice, or steal it with any other election official in the country. If it's a free and fair election, we will do what we've always done, we will honor it," Raskin said.

The congressman then implied conservatives fit "hallmark characteristics" of a "fascist political party," despite his own admission he would use House Democrats to prevent Trump from being inaugurated.

"I'll tell you, the political scientists have told us the hallmark characteristics of a fascist political party, number one, they don't accept the outcome of Democratic elections when they don't go their way. Number 2, they embrace political violence as an instrument of obtaining power," Raskin said.

According to a report from Reuters, Harris' campaign team has said Democrats are preparing to flood social media and media outlets with calls for calm if Trump prematurely declares himself the winner.

"As soon as he [Trump] falsely declares victory, we're ready to get up on TV and provide the truth and tap a broad network of people who can use their influence to push back," a top official with the Democratic National Committee reportedly told Reuters.

Former White House chief strategist Steve Bannon said conservative voters need to join forces and maximize votes for Trump, because the Democrats are willing to fight the election results.

"So, the election is a lot longer than next Tuesday ... November 5th, we have to drive and converge all our forces on the 5th to maximize ballots and maximize votes. But man, it doesn't end there," Bannon said.

Bannon noted the Democrats will try to reverse the results, or try to hit Trump hard enough to delegitimize his second term in office.

Mike Davis, founder and president of the Article III Project, said Trump needs to win the election by at least three or four percentage-points to make the results definitive.

"The Trump supporters need to continue to show up and vote as early as possible in massive numbers, and we need to win this thing decisively on November 5th by three or four points," Davis said.

Davis further added the Democrats are being led by Marc Elias, who Davis called a "savage" attorney on election integrity.

"They're gonna try and do everything they can to prevent Trump from getting inaugurated on January 20th," Davis said.

Key adviser to Tim Walz demands 'overthrow' of United States!

Insists under critical race theory the nation is 'irreversibly racist' and must be destroyed

A key adviser to Tim Walz, the leftist Minnesota governor chosen as a running mate by Kamala Harris, claims that the United States is so racist that it must be destroyed.

"Overthrow" is the word that was used by Brian Lozenski, described as an authority on the leftist Critical Race Theory that advocates that everything about America is racist and the only cure is more racism.

The Daily Signal describes him as Walz's "most important education adviser."

The report explains the video was brought to public attention by National Review, and it was posted online at <u>Tom Klingenstein</u>.

Lozenski describes what makes an "insurgent," an accusation Democrats have for years thrown at Republicans.

"The first tenet of critical race theory is that the United States as constructed is irreversibly racist. So if the nation-state as constructed is irreversibly racist, then it must be done with. It must be overthrown. And so we [proponents of critical race theory] can't be like, 'Oh no, critical race theory is just about telling our stories, and diversity.' It's not about that. It's about overthrow. It's insurgent. And we need to be, I think, more honest with that. It's funny that [critics] don't understand critical race theory, but they actually tell some truth when they're like, 'Yeah, it is anti-state.' You can't be a critical race theorist and be pro-U.S. It is a[n] anti-state theory that says the United States needs to be deconstructed, period."

Lozenski, with his anti-U.S. ideologies, was appointed by Walz to create curriculum standards for the Minnesota Department of Education.

The posting explained Lozenski's beliefs are "central to the education agenda Tim Walz has implemented in his state, and it is the core belief of the destructive Left of which Kamala Harris and Tim Walz have become the leaders. If they are elected, this is the vision that will govern from the White House."

Klingenstein is chairman of the Claremont Institute, and also is a public speaker, philanthropist, writer, and playwright.

The Daily Signal explained, "Lozenski isn't a marginal figure; he is a nationally known activist and academic and the foremost authority on 'ethnic studies' in Minnesota. He also is typical of the 'destructive Left' that wants to overthrow America. "



The report explained under the ideology promoted by Walz, according to Katherine Kersten of the Center of the American Experiment:

"First graders must 'identify examples of ethnicity, equality, liberation, and systems of power' and 'use those examples to construct meanings for those terms."

"Fourth-graders must 'identify the processes and impacts of colonization and examine how discrimination and the oppression of various racial and ethnic groups have produced resistance movements."

"High-school students are told to 'develop an analysis of racial capitalism' and 'anti-Blackness' and are taught to view themselves as members of 'racialized hierarchies' based on 'dominant European beauty standards."

Despite the revitalizing precipitation, the Saudi weather department issued warnings for continued severe weather in the coming days, including thunderstorms, hail, and heavy rainstorms accompanied by heavy winds.

Indeed, uncharacteristic precipitation has appeared in the normally arid region. Last month, the United Arab Emirates experienced heavy rains, thunderstorms, and hail. Snow fell several times in February on Jabal Al-Lawz in Tabuk, Saudi Arabia.

The weather department attributed these weather patterns to the extension of low-pressure systems in the Arabian Sea, which are moving towards Oman.

In 2016, parts of the Arabian Desert in Saudi Arabia experienced subzero temperatures, snowfall, and flooding. Average seasonal temperatures do not fall below 20 °C (68 °F). Snow also fell in Israel, Syria and other parts of the Middle East. In January 2016, snow fell between Mecca and Medina for the first time in 85 years.

Snow has also appeared in other unlikely areas. Last month, the Sahara Desert, the world's largest hot desert, was blanketed in snow last month following two freak snowstorms in 2018. This came after a 38-year hiatus in snow.

Such rare weather patterns may very well be a sign of the <u>Messianic era</u> as the prophet Isaiah speaks repeatedly of deserts blooming in his description of the <u>end of</u> days.

It's not about equity, democracy, free college, funding terrorists, defunding the police, breaking the glass ceiling, or any of the other suits the naked emperors and empresses wear. When the champagne corks and pills have been popped, the desire underneath is to destroy it all. Mediocre elites created leftism by sublimating their narcissistic drive to destroy everything superior to them into the revolutionary politics of a purported underclass.
