

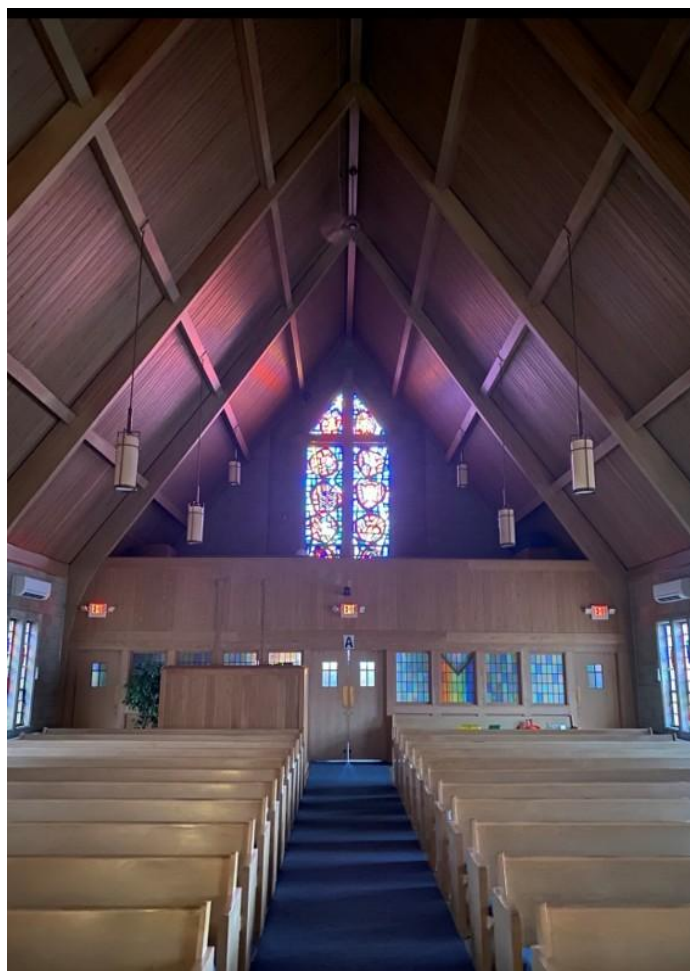
Dear All,
