#### **SESSION**

- Session members discussed ways to address financial concerns, which included the Endowment Fund recent guideline changes, the PCUSA Financial Planning workshop and various fundraisers.
- Elder Jean Smith reported on the Presbytery Assembly meeting that she attended that day on May 20<sup>th</sup>. The main items decided there included the decision to sell Geneva Center and the examination and approval of Jay Janke to the ministry at Lake Village Presbyterian Church.
- Plans were made to celebrate Pentecost on June 8<sup>th</sup>. The red geraniums, red paraments and doves will decorate the sanctuary.
- Pastor Tyler Orem thanked Gale Churitch, Abdul Savage, Jeffery Savage, Jean Smith and Cheryl Steen for cleaning up the cluttered attic in the old sanctuary.
- Plans were discussed for the first outdoor service of the summer on June 15<sup>th</sup>. Salad sales will be on June 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- Pastor Tyler Orem expressed his thanks to the choir for sharing their gifts of music this year. They will be on hiatus until the fall.
- The Session will not be meeting in June, so the next scheduled meeting will be on July 15.

#### **TRUSTEES**

Jeffery Savage, President of the Trustees, reported on their current focus to improve energy efficiency and reduce costs. This focus includes the following areas for consideration.

- NIPSCO will be contacted to do an energy audit and evaluation.
- The old refrigerator in the fellowship hall will be unplugged and removed. It is old and does not hold its seal. The refrigerator and freezer in the kitchen will remain.
- The air conditioners in the sanctuary can be reprogrammed during the week, when they are not used.
- Estimates are being gathered to replace the front sanctuary doors as they need to be replaced. There is a gap between the doors that allows outside air to come into the building.
- The feasibility of enclosing the large exhaust fans that are located behind the organ in the sanctuary is being considered.
- Ways to save energy in the old sanctuary building are being explored.

#### **DEACONS**

- Joys and concerns of the congregation were shared and the current prayer list was updated.
- A Sunshine Bag was prepared and Prayer Shawls are ready for gifting.
- Deacons continue to check and stock the Blessing box daily.
- Krissy LaFlech and her High School Students have done a wonderful service of preparing meals throughout the school year. Meals were prepared and delivered in April and May to homebound members of our congregation.
- Kelly LaFlech prepared forty sack lunches that were handed out on April 26<sup>th</sup> for Sackurday. Kiwanis will prepare and serve on May 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Pastor Tyler Orem and Pam Porter will continue to disperse funds to parishioners in need through the Smock Grant.
- New church directories have been approved and will be ready for Deacon's disbursement.

Tradewinds: Mission made a monetary donation to Tradewinds for their upcoming functional skills day camps for children and youth of all abilities.

Hammond Area Career Center: Mission made a monetary donation to the Hammond Area Career Center for the upcoming SkillsUSA Nationals event, which Robbie Casiano will be competing at.

Will you be traveling and attending Worship from afar? If so, please bring back a bulletin with you so it can be displayed on the bulletin board. We'd love to see where you have visited!!


