

Dear All,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Advent is finally upon us. It is the liturgical season I find most meaningful in my own spiritual life, and I know that it is rich with significance for our congregation and indeed for all of Creation for such a time as this. Advent is the season of waiting with expectant hope. It is the season of patience. It is the in-between, liminal season. It is the season of the both/and—liturgically longing for both the birth of Jesus and the second coming of Jesus. It is the season of remembrance and looking forward. Given that Advent means so much to me spiritually, it makes sense that there is a special place in my heart for Advent hymns. One of my favorites is *Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence*. The haunting tune and weighty text perfectly capture the mystery of this season. The first and third verses make me reflect the most with that feeling of awe and wonder that can only come with expectant hope.

Let all mortal flesh keep silence, And with fear and trembling stand; Ponder nothing earthly minded, For with blessing in His hand, Christ our God to earth descendeth, Our full homage to demand.

Rank on rank the host of heaven Spreads its vanguard on the way, As the Light of Light descendeth From the realms of endless day, That the powers of hell may vanish As the darkness clears away.

Friends, we have a lot to look forward to this season. Our confirmands will be completing their class and making their decisions about church membership. Our choir will be blessing us and giving glory to God with their cantata. Our young disciples will be preaching to us through drama. Our many missionaries will be serving the community and congregation. We will have Sunday morning worship services focused on what it means for ourselves and all of Creation to wait with expectant hope. We will have our beautiful Christmas Eve candlelight service. And in the warmth of our homes and families we will celebrate the blessed birth of Jesus, child of Mary, Savior of the world.

In the midst of all these activities, though, I encourage you to take intentional time to breathe in the Holy Spirit, to reflect on what it means to be in a liminal time of waiting, and to pray. Let all mortal flesh keep silence.


